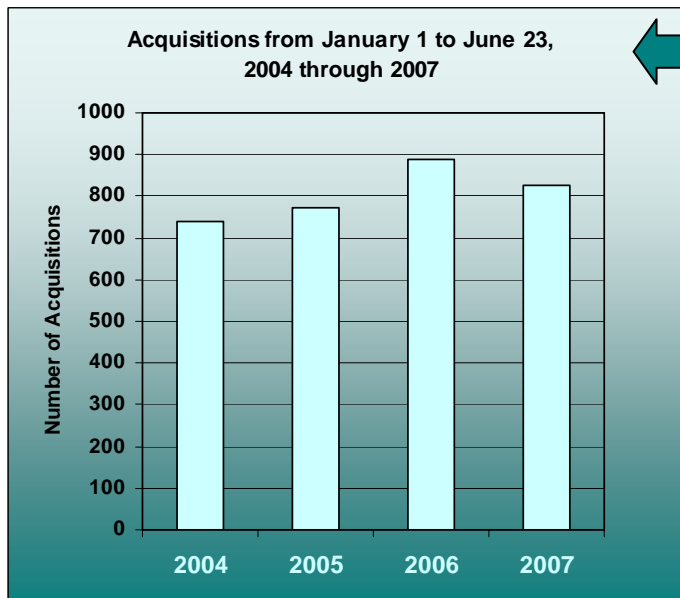
Second Quarter Report- June 30 2007

From January 1 to June 23, 2007, WRI received 828 acquisitions at our clinic – approximately 1000 animals. In some cases, one acquisition record will be for multiple animals (such as clutches of baby birds). Thus, the number of acquisitions is always smaller than the actual number of animals received.

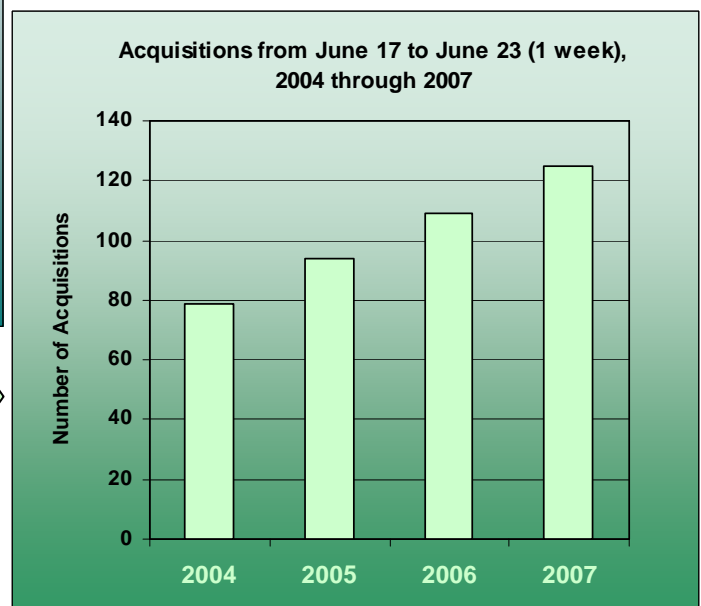
As shown in the table and charts below, there has been a relatively steady increase in acquisitions since WRI opened it’s clinic at the Rio Grande Nature Center State Park in 2003. Year-round operating hours and greater promotion and public awareness of WRI’s activities are assumed to be the major reasons for this increase in acquisitions.

Though we have received fewer acquisitions in 2007 than the previous year, it is difficult at this time to predict a decrease in the rate of growth of WRI’s acquisitions in the future. In other words, this may be a fluke rather than an actual statistical trend.



Compared to the same week in June in 2004, WRI has received 46 more acquisitions in 2007, about a 58% increase. Though this is only one week of the year, this “snap shot” supports the idea that our 2007 busy season is busier than ever before.

WRI continues to monitor trends in acquisitions and other characteristics of our data, and will report again, and in greater detail, on this topic in our state and federal 2007 End of the Year Report due Jan. 30, 2008.
