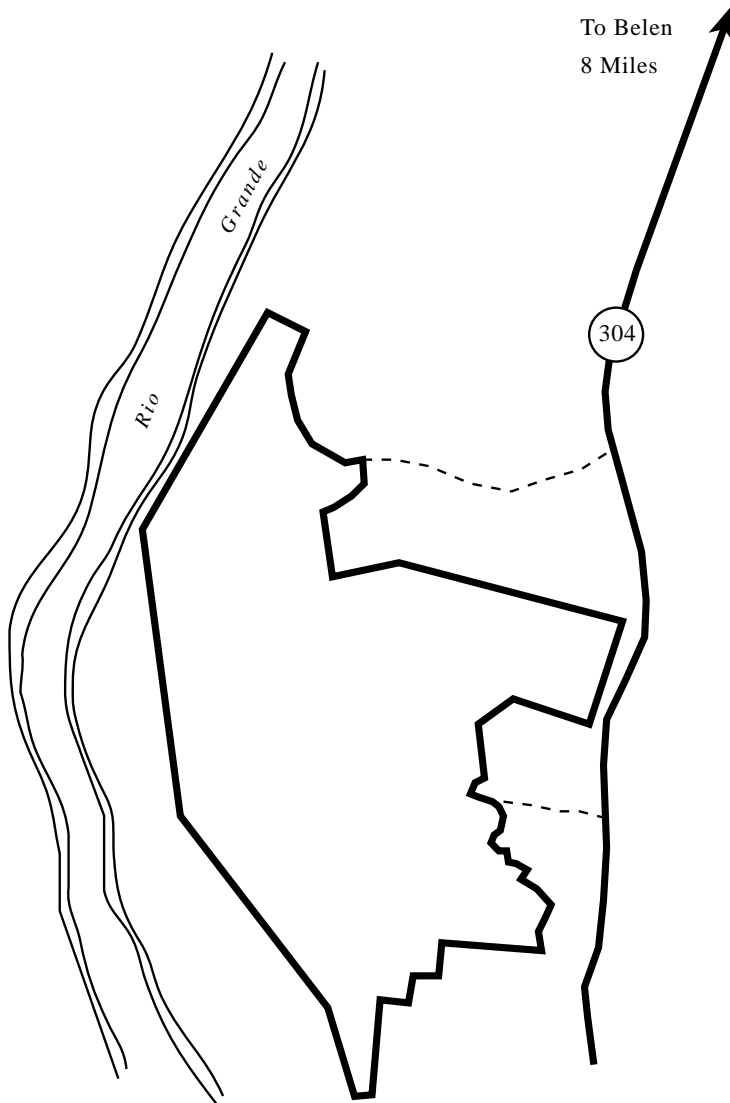
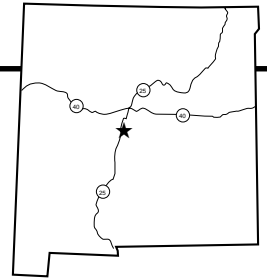




State Wildlife Areas

Casa Colorada Wildlife Area



Ducks, geese and sandhill cranes alight after their migration down the Rio Grande, and they find food and shelter at Casa Colorada. The State Game Commission acquired this 423 acre area to help feed wintering waterfowl; the birds respond in their own flapping, noisy way.

From Casa Colorada, birds may fly to private lands or to nearby state and federal wildlife refuges to find additional feed and habitat.

Generally, grain crops are left standing until needed for feed, when they are knocked down by farm machinery.

Non-farmed areas are maintained to enhance habitat for pheasants, furbearers and raptors.

To provide a secure habitat at Casa Colorada, public entry is generally closed except as may be allowed in the annual hunting regulations.
