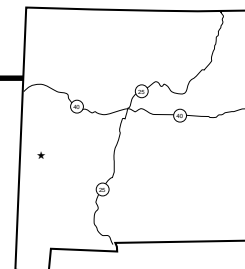
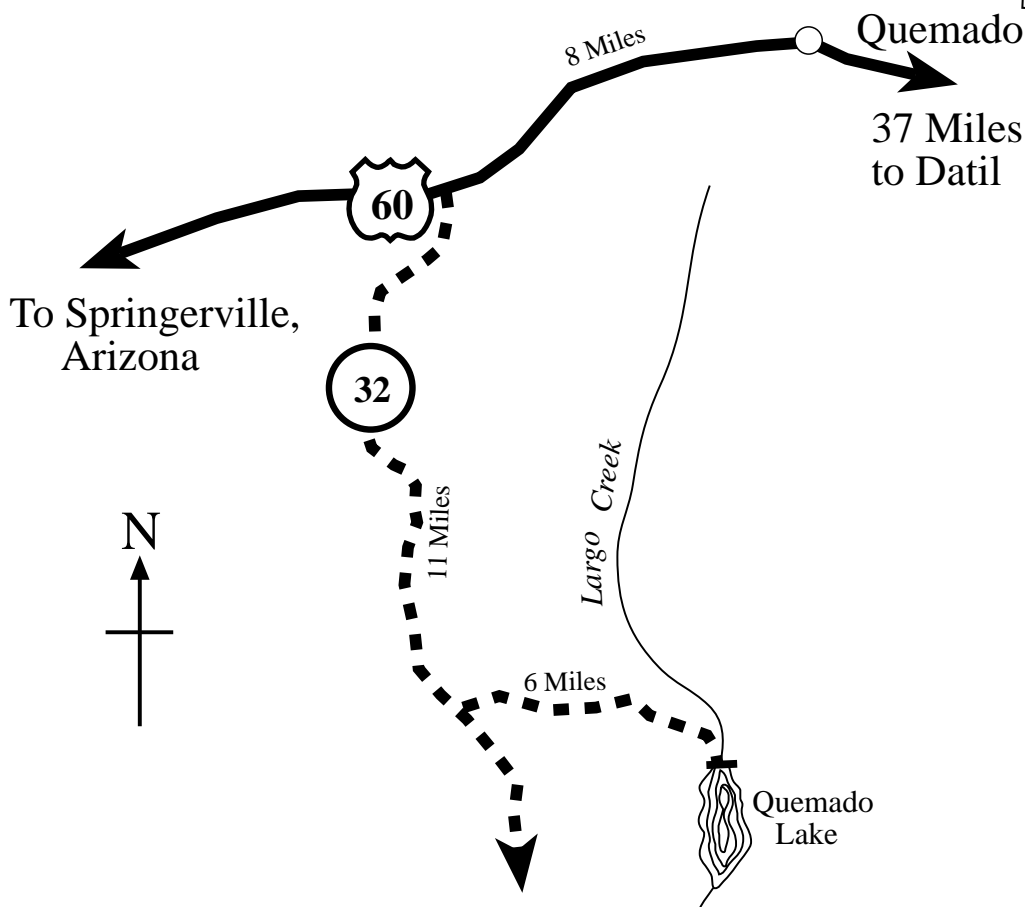

Quemado Lake



Quemado Lake, formerly called Largo Creek Dam, enhances the splendor of Largo Canyon 12 miles south of the village of Quemado.

This trout lake, nestled at 7,600 feet elevation, was completed in the fall of 1971 and formally dedicated in April 1972. The 130-surface-acre lake provides trout angling opportunity in a location where trout fishing never existed.

Quemado consistently produces large rainbow trout. Fishing is best fall to spring when water temperatures are cooler.

The U.S. Forest Service has developed numerous campground and picnic facilities at Quemado. Some fee sites have electrical and water hookups available May through September. Primitive campsites also are available.
