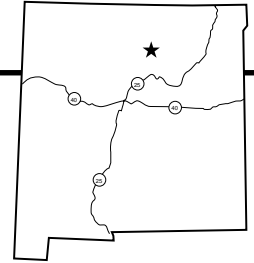
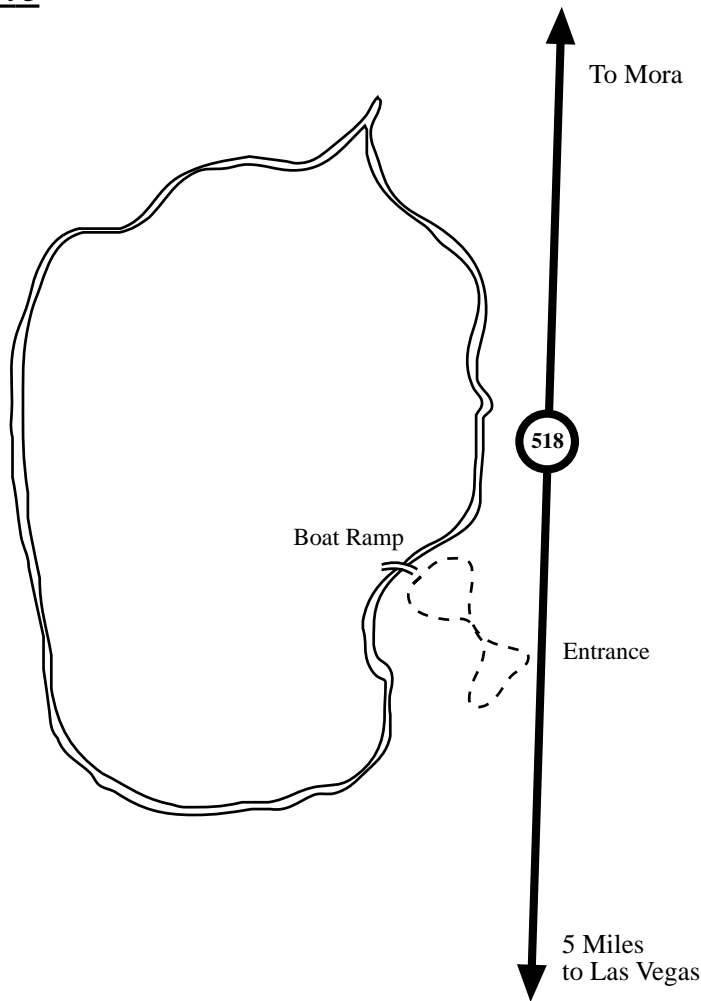




State Wildlife Areas



Storrie Lake



There is a fine state park near Las Vegas, offering sweeping views of both New Mexico plains and the Sangre de Cristo Mountains. Fishing from the bank or by boat is available. The Department manages the fishery, which includes substantial stocking of rainbow trout. Crappie are also found here. The lake's maximum depth is about 35 feet when full.

It is supplied by ground runoff and a diversion ditch from the Gallinas River. Outflow goes to McAllister Lake, east of Las Vegas. The original Storrie Lake earth dam was built in 1919. Elevation is about 6,500 feet, and the scenery is pleasant for fishermen, picnickers and windsurfers.
