License Revocations

Before you today are four separate groups of individuals subject to revocations for your approval.

- **Group 1** - Revocation of Individuals which have not contested or requested a hearing.
- **Group 2** - Revocation of individuals subject to revocation who have been granted a stipulated agreement.
- **Group 3** - Revocation of individuals issued as part of the Wildlife Violators Compact.
- **Group 4** - Revocation of individuals that are subject to Parental Responsibility Act (PRA).



Group 1 - Revocation of 28 individuals who have not requested a hearing.

- The Department has presented a list of 28 individuals that meet the established criteria for initiation of the suspension process for hunting, fishing and trapping license privileges.
- Each of these individuals has been served with a Notice of Contemplated Action, and have been offered the opportunity for a hearing to rebut or explain the violation points that they have accumulated.
- These individuals did not request a hearing, and the list contains the Department's recommendation for revocation and time period, in accordance with rule.



Group 2 – Revocation of 5 individuals with stipulated agreements

- In accordance with Commission Rule 19.31.2.13 C “Stipulated Agreements.” By signing the stipulated agreement the individual agrees with the terms set forth and they waive their right to a hearing and filing of a written exception.
- Five (5) individuals elected to enter into a Stipulated Agreement with the Department.
- These agreements have been approved by the Department and are presented to the Commission consideration and approval.



Group 3 – Revocation of 31 individuals of the Wildlife Violators Compact

- 31 individuals that meet the criteria for reciprocal revocation of violators that have been revoked for committing wildlife violations in another compact state.
- Each of these individuals was convicted of wildlife violations in other compact states, if those same violations were committed in New Mexico, they would have accrued at least 20 points, thus being subject to having their license privileges revoked here.
- They all went through the original state's due process before having their privileges revoked.
- The recommended time period is determined by the end date of the original revocation.




Group – 4: Revocation of 240 individuals due to the Parental Responsibility Act (PRA)

- 240 obligors that the Human Services Department reported as being out of compliance with PRA in May.
- The Commission is required to suspend all license privileges for non-compliant obligors until they return into compliance.
