Shoot Virtual at Your School and Submit Scores

Registration: March 1st, 2021 – April 30th, 2021; Registration fee: \$ 3.00 per shooter

Format Overview:

- This is a virtual tournament – teams will shoot individually at their home school under the direct supervision of their NASP certified (BAI) coach.
- Tournament format will follow the national 2021 NASP Tournament Sanctioned Rules & Protocols.
- Official tournament competition can take place anytime between April 5th – April 30th.
- Official scores must be submitted through the www.nasptournaments.org website by April 30th, 2021 - 10 PM.
- Each archer will shoot 15 arrows @10 meters and 15 arrows @15 meters.
Format as follows:
 - 10 Meters: 5 arrows for practice, three 5 arrow ends (15 arrows) for score.
 - 15 Meters: 5 arrows for practice, three 5 arrow ends (15 arrows) for score.
 - This is the same format used at NASP in-person state, national, and world tournaments.
- Tournament arrangement must follow all standing New Mexico Public Health Orders. For example, if group sizes are limited, adhere to the order and shoot over multiple days or weeks if necessary.

Tournament Rules and Information:

1. Go to www.nasptournaments.org to register a team or individual.
2. Competition can be held as a one-day tournament or multiple mini tournaments on varying days to accommodate small group gathering limitations. (i.e. – before school, after school or during physical education classes)
3. Only NASP students are eligible (students must be a participant of an in-school curriculum lasting 2-8 weeks, a minimum of 10 hours).
4. Only NASP students in grades 4th through 12th are eligible to compete.
5. Each archer may only shoot once for their tournament score.
6. Teams may consist of 12-24 archers which must include no fewer than four of each gender. Only one team per school is allowed.
7. If school doesn't meet the minimum requirements for a team, they may register archers in the individual category.
8. Schools can have an unlimited number of individual participants.
9. Competitions will consist of teams from three divisions: Elementary (fourth-fifth); Middle (sixth-eighth); and High School (ninth – twelfth).
10. Coaches must be NASP Basic Archery Instructor (BAI) certified to register students.
11. Only scores submitted by April 30th (10 PM) through the www.nasptournament.org website will be considered for awards.
12. Tournament fees must be paid in full prior to April 30th, 2021 to NASP Inc., c/o Michelle Huibregtse to be eligible for awards.
13. All registration documents must be signed and submitted to Bruce Atencio, NASP State Coordinator at Bruce.Atencio@state.nm.us.

2021 Tournament Prep Sheet

The 2021 New Mexico NASP Virtual State Championship will follow the 2021 NASP National, Open & Championship Rules. Please ensure that all rules, including the following, are being enforced. Virtual based tournaments that do not follow all rules will not be recognized as an official 2021 tournament team. The tournament host Basic Archery Instructor (BAI) is responsible for participant safety and the enforcement of these rules.

In School Requirement (Section 1.2)

- ✓ NASP lessons must be conducted as part of the in-school curriculum, a minimum of 10 hours per school, per year. You have until the end of the academic school year to meet this requirement.

Eligible Grades (Section 1.4)

- ✓ Only students who are in grades 4th -12th by the date of the tournament may participate.

Number of Archers per Team (Section 1.5)

- ✓ A NASP archery team must have a minimum of 12 archers, at least 4 of which must be the opposite gender.
- ✓ Schools may have an unlimited number of archers on their team.
- ✓ A scoring team consists of the 12 highest scores with at least 4 of the opposite gender.
- ✓ A school is allowed to have only one team.

Range Set-up (Section 4.1)

- ✓ Follow all State & Local Covid-19 Health Orders. <https://cv.nmhealth.org/>
- ✓ Modification may be necessary due to current New Mexico Public Health Orders. Utilize the NASP Social Distancing Guidelines for modifications regarding: range lane spacing; equipment management; and scored shooting. <https://www.naspschools.org/>
- ✓ There will be 10-meter (32' 10") and 15-meter (49' 2") shooting line (4.1.5).
- ✓ Clearly identify the shooting range. Clearly mark the waiting, shooting and target lines.
- ✓ Shooting range should be properly signed and doors secured beyond the waiting line.

Arrow Handling and Movement About the Range (Section 4.3)

- ✓ Archers must walk when moving about the range (4.3.1).
- ✓ While shooting, the archer must straddle the shooting line (4.3.3).
- ✓ The quiver must remain on the shooting line and within the 30-inch area assigned to the archer (4.3.5.3).
- ✓ While both archers may approach the target when scoring, only one archer may remain at the target when arrows are pulled. The other archer must be safely behind the target line while arrows are being pulled from the target (4.3.6).
- ✓ Archers must remain on their feet and off their knees when scoring and pulling arrows (4.3.7).
- ✓ Arrow points must be covered with one hand and shafts grasped below the vanes with the other hand when walking with arrows (4.3.8).

Whistle Commands (Section 4.2)

- ✓ NASP whistle commands will be used to operate the range (4.2).

Scoring (Section 5.0)

- ✓ Archers cannot score their own target.
- ✓ Only archers and tournament officials will be allowed downrange of the waiting line (5.1).
- ✓ All arrows should be scored before any arrow or the target's face is touched (5.2).
- ✓ An arrow shaft touching a scoring ring line is awarded the higher point value (5.3.1).
- ✓ If archers cannot agree on an arrow's score, a range official must be asked for the final decision (5.7.4).

Verifying and Submitting Scores

- ✓ A signed Tournament Witness Verification form must be submitted with a hard copy of your team's scores.
- ✓ A hard copy of your team's score must be e-mailed to Bruce Atencio (NASP State Coordinator) by tournament deadline.
- ✓ A School Administrator, Counselor or Athletic Director must be present to verify tournament format and scoring.
- ✓ Official scores must be submitted through the www.nasptournaments.org website by April 30th, 2021 - 10 PM.

As the NASP Tournament host BAI, I confirm that I have read and understand the 2021 NASP National, Open and Championship Tournament Rules, and all rules will be followed and enforced. I also realize that if I do not comply with any part of these rules, my tournament scores will not be considered valid and will not be accepted for scoring and placement for the 2021 New Mexico Virtual State Archery Championship.

- ✓ **As a Tournament Witness your responsibility is to observe the operational functions of the tournament and authenticate the guidelines listed below as well as observing a safe, honest and organized competition.**

Who Can Be A Tournament Witness? (* should have no direct connection to an archer on the team (i.e. parent or assistant coach))

- ✓ School/District Administrator, Counselor, Athletic Director, School Staff Member, City Council Member, Archery Shop Owner

Tournament Dates

- ✓ Competition may take place anytime between April 5th, 2021 through April 30th, 2021.
- ✓ Competition can be held as a one-day tournament or multiple mini tournaments on varying days to accommodate small group gathering limitations. (i.e. – before school, after school or during physical education classes)

Eligible Grades

- ✓ Only students who are in grades 4th -12th by the date of the tournament may participate.
- ✓ A NASP archery team must have a minimum of 12 archers, at least 4 of which must be the opposite gender.
- ✓ Schools may have an unlimited number of archers on their team.

Range Set-up

- ✓ Follow all State & Local Covid-19 Health Orders. <https://cv.nmhealth.org/> Ask tournament host for a copy.
- ✓ Modification may be necessary due to current New Mexico Public Health Orders. Utilize the NASP Social Distancing Guidelines for modifications regarding: range lane spacing; equipment management; and scored shooting. <https://www.naspschools.org/>. Ask tournament host for a copy.
- ✓ Shooting range should have warning signs and doors secured beyond the waiting line.
- ✓ There should be 3 clearly identifiable lines on the shooting range: waiting line; shooting line; and target line.

Shooting Format

- ✓ Archers will shoot 15 arrows at a distance of 10 meters and 15 arrows at a distance of 15 meters. Thirty arrows total.

Arrow Handling and Movement About the Range

- ✓ Archers must walk when moving about the range.
- ✓ While shooting, the archer must straddle the shooting line.
- ✓ If two archers approach the target when scoring, only one archer may remain at the target when arrows are pulled. The other archer must be safely behind the target line while arrows are being pulled from the target.
- ✓ Archers must remain on their feet and off their knees when scoring and pulling arrows.
- ✓ Arrow points must be covered with one hand and shafts grasped below the vanes with the other hand when walking with arrows.

Whistle Commands

- ✓ NASP whistle commands will be used to operate the range

Scoring

- ✓ Archers cannot score their own target.
- ✓ Only archers and tournament officials will be allowed downrange of the waiting line.
- ✓ All arrows should be scored before any arrow or the target's face is touched.
- ✓ An arrow shaft touching a scoring ring line is awarded the higher point value.
- ✓ If archers cannot agree on an arrow's score, a range official must be asked for the final decision.

Social Distancing and NASP®

The following information is provided **only as recommendations** if social distancing and disinfecting practices are required by appropriate government or health authorities to protect the health of participants.

NASP® is being contacted by individuals for guidance, as they plan for the future opening of archery. NASP® has and will continue to follow the advice of state and federal health officials regarding any activities. NASP® is in no way promoting group archery activities until authorities believe it is safe to do so. As has been the case for our nearly two decades of existence, safety is our first priority.

If activities and gatherings are allowed, but with social distancing mandates, these are among the precautions that can be taken in the management of a NASP® archery range and NASP® student archers, be it for a class, practice, or tournament.

Range Lane Spacing - Avoiding Shared Breath and Touching

- Whatever safe spacing distance is required, that would also be the minimum width of lanes on the range. In other words, if 6 feet continues to be the recommended safe distancing, lanes should be 6 feet wide with a single archer per lane; standing in the middle of the lane.
- If archers shoot the same target during a flight, only one archer at a time should go to the target line to score and retrieve arrows.
- The waiting line should also be marked and managed to maintain safe distancing.

Equipment Management - Avoiding Cross-Contamination

- Students should each have their own, without sharing, personal Stringbow, when learning and practicing the *Eleven Steps to Archery Success*. The same would hold true if the archers are using armguards, gloves, or finger tabs.
- If the archer is wearing a face mask, care should be taken that all parts of the mask are such that they won't be snagged by the string when released. Bowhunters routinely shoot while wearing face masks.
- When retrieving or returning bows to the bow rack, only one archer should be at the bow rack at a time. If the range has multiple bow racks, they should be spaced according to social distancing requirements to allow multiple archers to pick up and return bows.
- Each archer's bow should be on its own hook with no sharing of bow or hook unless disinfected between archers.

- Shared bows and arrows should be regularly disinfected. To disinfect, the CDC indicates, "Most common EPA-registered household disinfectants will work". Except caustic agents such as bleach should be kept off the bowstring.
 - Soap and water
 - 60% or greater alcohol wipes
 - Bleach should be avoided on bowstrings.
- Special care should be taken to maintain safe distancing when setting up or taking down the range if students help.

Scored Shooting - Avoiding Cross-Contamination

- Each archer should have a scorecard on their own scoreboard. The opposing archer (adjacent lane) will record the competitor's arrows, lay the scoreboard/card on the target line, and the archer will review the marked scores for accuracy.
- The approval box of each arrow line should be checked by the scoring archer after the archer who shot the arrows agrees with the score.
- To avoid handling each other's cards, they should be unsigned and collected by a gloved official or handed in by the archer who handled the card.

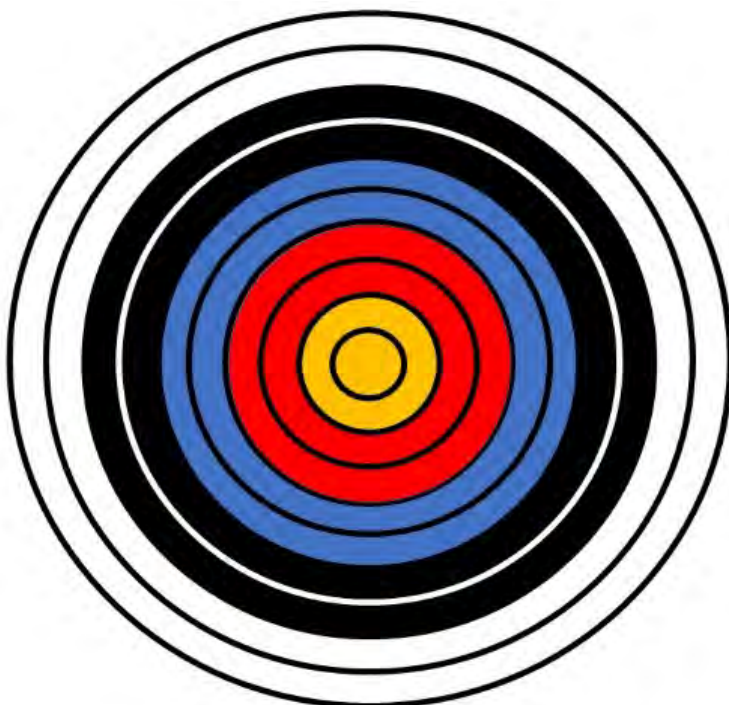
