




# Pecos Complex Wildlife Areas



**Location:** Pecos Complex Wildlife Area consists of various sites within the Pecos River Valley north of Pecos. They include the Bert Clancy, Mora, Tererro and Jamie Koch areas.

**Total Acreage:** 1,967 acres.

**Purchase:** Pecos Complex Wildlife Area was purchased in parcels beginning in 1950 to provide fishing and recreational access to the Pecos River.

**Description:** The various sites lie along the Pecos River. Cottonwood, pine, and willows abound in the area.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Wildlife Viewing</li> <li>✓ Photographing</li> </ul>	<p><b>Wildlife Viewing</b>-Wildlife watchers may see various wildlife year-round. Good binoculars are important. The best time to view wildlife is at dawn or dusk.</p> <p><b>Photographing</b>-The best time to photograph wildlife is at dawn or dusk.</p> <p><b>Hiking</b>-Hiking is the best way to see wildlife at the Pecos Complex Wildlife Area year-round or other wildlife management areas.</p> <p><b>Bicycling</b>-Allowed only on established roads.</p> <p><b>Horseback Riding</b>-Allowed but opportunities are extremely limited.</p> <p><b>Camping</b>-primitive camping allowed in designated areas.</p> <p><b>Fishing</b>-Year-round fishing.</p> <p><b>Hunting</b>-No hunting opportunities.</p> <p><b>Closures</b>-No closures.</p> <p><b>Facilities</b>-Rest rooms and primitive camping are available at each site. Drinking water is not available.</p> <p><b>Fees</b>-Anglers must have appropriate licenses and permits. Wildlife viewers, photographers, hikers, bicyclists, and horseback riders must have a valid license or permit.
