


Urraca Wildlife Area





Location: Urraca Wildlife Area is located about 12 miles north of Questa.

Total Acreage: 13,304 acres.

Purchase: Urraca was purchased in 1966 to provide winter habitat for deer and elk.

Description: The Urraca Wildlife Area sits on the western slope of the Sangre de Cristo Mountains. It rises up from dry sagebrush flats to aspen and pine groves found at more than 11,000 feet in elevation.

What to See, Do, and Learn

Wildlife Viewing-Wildlife watchers may see various wildlife species. Good binoculars are important. The best time to view wildlife is at dawn or dusk. Allowed April 1-May 14 and again from July 1-December 14.

Photographing-The best time to photograph wildlife is at dawn or dusk. A telephoto lens is important. Allowed April 1-May 14 and again from July 1-December 14.

Hiking-Hiking is the best way to see wildlife at the Urraca Wildlife Area or other wildlife management areas. Allowed April 1-May 14 and again from July 1-December 14.

Bicycling-Allowed only on established roads. Allowed April 1-May 14 and again from July 1-December 14. Hunters may use bicycles during their hunt.

Horseback Riding-Allowed April 1-May 14 and again from July 1-December 14.

Camping-Allowed only by licensed hunters in designated areas and only during their hunt.

Hunting-Deer, elk, and small game hunting allowed to hunters with legal licenses and permits only during open seasons.

Fishing-There are no fishing opportunities at Urraca.

Closures-Urraca is closed to all access December 15-March 31 and again from May 15-June 30.

Facilities-Uraca Wildlife Area has primitive camping only for hunters but does not have rest rooms or drinking water.

Fees-Hunters and anglers must have appropriate licenses and permits. Wildlife viewers, photographers, hikers, bicyclists,

and horseback riders must have a valid license or permit. See the Department's site www.wildlife.state. nm.us for more information.

Motorized Vehicles-Not allowed beyond parking area.
