Wildlife Management Division

- Worked with Colorado Parks and Wildlife to successfully capture and release 24 ptarmigan in the Pecos Wilderness, to augment the small extant population as part of the 2017 State Ptarmigan Recovery Plan.

-46 Desert bighorn sheep were translocated from the Red Rock Facility to the Alamo Waco Mountains. These sheep will create a new population of desert sheep, further expanding and stabilizing the species.

- Vidal Creek headwater restoration was implemented in August before the hunts began, and utilized \$100k of HSP funding and \$300k of PR dollars to install 155 structures designed to enhance and conserve slope wetland and riparian areas important for a wide variety of upland and aquatic wildlife species.

-Completion of annual elk population surveys across the state.

Fisheries Management Division

- The kokanee spawn occurred due to significant interdivisional cooperation.

- Glenwood hatchery renovations are continuing as planned. Substantial completion is anticipated for April 2022.

- Completed second rotenone treatment in Costilla for RGCT.

Law Enforcement Division

- In the process of hiring 5 new recruits to add to the 7 currently in training.

-Dealing with multiple moose sightings in the Farmington area and developing a plan if relocation becomes necessary.

- Dealing with GMU 48 and HWY 199 access issues as well as complaints from folks about amount of non-hunting OHV use.

- Hunting season and associated patrols (to include wilderness patrols), roadblocks, artificial wildlife operations, night flights, investigations, etc. are occurring amongst other duties.

- Andrew Armendariz was recently promoted to Training Lt. position and has actively begun recruiting efforts.

-Officers continue to respond to a wide variety of calls from wildlife related to car accidents to threats of suicide.

Environmental and Ecological Planning Division

- Ginny Seamster was recently promoted to the Assistant Chief Position.

- Working with the Department of Transportation and their contractor to finalize the Wildlife Corridors Act Draft Action Plan.

-12 Projects were selected for funding under the Share With Wildlife Program.

Administrative Services Division

- The Human Resources division has been asked to help EMNRD with processing of HR actions for EMNRD employees.

Information and Education Division

-Education staff are back to offering small in-person workshops, clinics and classes. Everything from basic fishing skills, wildlife conservation, hunter education and off-highway vehicle safety training.

-The Department's Spanish translation efforts continue to pick up, including the 2022-2023 Rules and Information booklets.

-With the assistance of D.J. Case and Associates, the Department completed a social media listening study that will help shape social media messages.

-The Department completed an analysis of alternative funding sources and public perceptions of these options. We will be posting this to the web site and using it going forward as a basis for discussion about future funding.

-Due to supply chain issues for paper, the Department was told there will not be paper available to print Rules and Information Booklets (RIBs) until likely February. The Department will be encouraging people to go digital this year and the Department plans to simplify access to the electronic RIB. The Department is trying to have a limited number of RIBs printed in both English and Spanish.

-Finally – we have received notice from the USFWS that PR receipts are up approximately 66% and DJ receipts are down approximately 3.7%. We do not have apportionment numbers yet but expect the PR apportionment to be significantly higher this year and DJ to be slightly lower.

RECOVERING AMERICA'S WILDLIFE ACT

This bill provides funding for (1) the conservation or restoration of wildlife and plant species of greatest conservation need; (2) the wildlife conservation strategies of states, territories or the District of Columbia; and (3) wildlife conservation education and recreation projects. For New Mexico, the bill is estimated to bring \$27 million in federal funds for SGCN work. The bill will require a \$9 million match which we have requested via a special appropriation from the General Fund. A total of \$36 million would then be available to conserve species and habitats that have not traditionally been a focus of management.

LEGISLATURE

The Department has three legislative priorities during this short 30-day financial session. Our FY 23 budget request which includes a total requested increase of 10%, a request for a special appropriation to provide match in anticipation of passage of RAWA and our Capital Outlay request of \$19.5 million for dam repairs, hatchery renovations and habitat enhancement.
