




Black-footed Ferret

- Critically endangered obligate predator of prairie dogs thought to be extinct twice. One of the rarest mammals on the planet.
- One of the last specimens collected in New Mexico was trapped by Elliot Barker on Vermejo Park Ranch.
- Requires large, disease free prairie dog colonies in order to persist—habitat specialist.















Black-tailed Prairie Dog: 500 – 10,000 acres Gunnison's Prairie Dog: 20 – 4,000 acres

Summary of Black-footed Ferret Project at Vermejo Park Ranch

- 1999-2005: Pen pre-conditioning.
- 2005-2007: Wild pre-conditoining.
- 2008-2012: Ferrets released on black-tailed prairie dogs. Determined habitat not suitable.
- 2012-Present: Ferrets released Gunnison's colonies.

Future

Continue with Black-footed ferret program on the Gunnison's prairie dog colonies

Shift USFWS permit from 10(a)(1)(A) to a Safe Harbor Agreement
