Hunting and Fishing License Revocation



License Revocation

- The Department will present a list of individuals that meet the established criteria for initiation of the suspension process for hunting, fishing and trapping license privileges.
- Each of these individuals has been served with a Notice of Contemplated Action, and been offered the opportunity for a hearing to contest or explain the violation points that they have accumulated.



 Three individuals requested a hearing within the time limits prescribed, however, due to delays in the mail, we did not receive their requests until after the Commission voted to revoke their privileges at the November meeting. The Department is recommending that the Commission suspend their decision to revoke these individuals' privileges pending the outcome of their hearings.



 One Registered Outfitter has failed to provide proof of liability insurance, as required by law. He was served with a warning notice, and then a Notice of Contemplated Action, and has been offered the opportunity for a hearing. The Department is recommending that his Outfitter Registration be suspended until he is in compliance, and has paid the \$250.00 Reinstatement Fee.



Failure to Pay Penalty Assessment

- 414 individuals who have failed to pay a penalty assessment within 30 days of the violation
- 17-2-10.2 NMSA requires that all penalty assessments be submitted within thirty days of issuance, 17-2-10.3 authorizes the Commission to revoke the hunting and fishing licenses of a person who fails to pay the penalty assessment



Parental Responsibility Act

- 233 obligors that the Human Services
 Department reported as being out of compliance with court ordered child support.
- The Commission is required to suspend all license privileges for non-compliant obligors until they return into compliance.
