Discussion on the Use of Magnification/Verifier Devices on Archery Equipment



Current Rule

• 19.31.10.7.E. "Bow" shall mean compound, recurve, or long bow. Sights on bows shall not project light nor magnify.

• Some hunters who have difficulty focusing on their sight pins have expressed a desire to use a "Verifier" on their bow sights.



Magnification/Verifier Devices

- Used when shooting with pins to provide a clearer view of the pins
- The Verifier has <u>one</u> lens installed in the peep which is similar to reading glasses. This allows the shooter to see the <u>sight pins</u> more clearly. It does not magnify the target but does slightly magnify the pins.







VS. Clarifiers

- A clarifier is used when you shoot with a scope with a lens to clear up the target
- A clarifier is a lens installed in the peep that will allow you to see the <u>target</u> more clearly when used with another lens in your scope or sight. Clarifiers are only used if you shoot with a scope (or pin sight) with a lens. Clarifiers are meant for the 2 lenses to work together to provide a clearer target image.

Scopes

- We can change the definition of "bows" in rule to allow for the legal use of verifiers, clarifiers and scopes.
- 19.31.10.7.E. "Bow" shall mean compound, recurve, or long bow. Sights on bows shall not project light.

 nor magnify.
- The use of crossbows during an archery hunt would still be limited to those who are registered with the Department as "Mobility Impaired" (MI).
