Summary of previous rule change

- APLUS: Public & private hunters assigned to ranches
- 2019-2022 Pronghorn Rule
 - Similar to deer hunting and secondary mgmt. zone for elk
 - Public draw hunters allowed to hunt public land within the drawn
 GMU
 - Private land licenses over the counter (OTC).

Summary of previous rule change

- Addressed unhunted populations and high B:D ratios in some locations
- Increased public draw licenses by 22%
- Increased resident draw licenses by 26%





Pronghorn Biology

- Statewide population estimate: ~70,800 (midpoint)
- 36 bucks: 100 does: 25 fawns (2019-2021 survey data)



2021-2022 Pronghorn License and Harvest

- 6,857 Licenses sold
 - 94% are for bucks
- 65% of hunters reported
- 70% successful in harvesting
- Estimated statewide harvest
 - Bucks = 4655; Does = 282
- Satisfaction rating = 4.1



Pronghorn Biology: NE Area

- Population estimate: ~45,000
 - (stable to slightly ♠)
- 32 bucks*: 100 does: 27 fawns
- Proposed changes
 - Because of limited access to public land in GMU 57, the Department recommends decreasing each hunt by 5 licenses each and moving these licenses to adjacent GMU 58 that has more public access.






Pronghorn data: SE Area

- Population estimate: ~20,000 (stable)
- 35 bucks: 100 does: 31 fawns
- Actively restoring populations (fence modifications & translocation)
- Create an injured service member pronghorn hunt on Melrose Air Force Range in GMU 32
- Allow pronghorn hunting on prairie chicken areas (PCAs)
- McGregor range adjusting tags from 5 MB non military and 10 MB military to 7 MB of each



Pronghorn data: SW Area

- Population estimate: ~ 3,000 (stable to slightly decreasing)
- 58 bucks*: 100 does: 17 fawns
- GMUs 15 and 16 GMU 15: eliminate the 2nd hunt but







Pronghorn data: NW Area

- Population estimate: <1,000 (slightly decreasing)
- Ratios: N/A Due to low survey abundance
- Proposed changes
 - Due to low pronghorn numbers decreas license in GMUs
 2, 7, 9, 10 from 15 bow licenses down to 10 and from 15 any sporting arm licenses down to 5.



Pronghorn data: Tres Piedras



- Population estimate: <500 (Stable)
- 50 bucks: 100 does: 12 fawns



No change to the weapon type of the last pronghorn hunt
