

STATE GAME COMMISSION MEETING AND RULE MAKING NOTICE

The New Mexico State Game Commission (“Commission”) will be hosting a meeting and rule hearings on Friday June 3, 2022 beginning at 9:00 a.m. at the Eagle Nest Lake State Park Visitor Center, 42 Marina Way, Eagle Nest, NM 87718. The purpose of this meeting is to hear and consider action as appropriate on the following: presentation of proposed changes to the Bighorn Sheep, Pronghorn, and Javelina rules.

**Synopsis:**

The proposal is to amend the Bighorn Sheep Rule 19.31.17 NMAC, Pronghorn Rule 19.31.15 NMAC, and Javelina Rule 19.31.21 NMAC, all of which will become effective April 1, 2023. The most recent version of each rule will expire on March 31, 2023.

**PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE BIGHORN SHEEP RULE:** 1) opening the Jemez population for hunting Aug. 10-24 and Sept. 1-15, likely beginning in the 2024 season; 2) splitting the Hatchet Mountains hunt area into the Little Hatchets and Big Hatchets hunt areas and shifting hunt dates to September 15-30 and October 1-15; 3) creating 2 hunt windows in the Peloncillos (Nov. 1-15 & Nov. 16-30) and Ladrones (Dec. 1-15 & Dec. 16-31); 4) creating a 3rd hunt window in the Rio Grande Gorge population, Nov. 1-15; 5) including the Double E Wildlife Management Area as open to hunters that hold a valid license for that GMU; 6) making small adjustments to season dates in some areas.

**PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE PRONGHORN RULE:** 1) modifying the definition of a muzzle-loader to include only those muzzle-loading firearms that do not have a scope (for all big game species); 2) shifting hunt structure slightly to begin later in August and have some hunts begin in September and October; 3) creating a pronghorn hunt on Melrose Air Force Range in GMU 32; 4) decreasing license numbers in the combined hunts in GMUs 2, 7, 9, 10 from 15 bow licenses to 10 and from 15 any sporting arm licenses to 5; 5) GMU 15: eliminate the 2nd any legal sporting arm hunt but reallocate the 5 licenses to the first any legal sporting arm hunt; 6) GMU 16: eliminate the 2nd any legal sporting arm hunt but reallocate the 10 licenses to the remaining hunts; 6) decreasing each hunt in GMU 57 by 5 licenses each and moving these licenses to adjacent GMU 58 that has more public access; 7) allowing pronghorn hunting on Prairie Chicken Areas in the SE part of the state; 9) adjusting licenses on McGregor Range from 5 MB non-military and 10 MB military to 7 MB of each.

**PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE JAVELINA RULE:** 1) including a population management hunt option; 2) expanding the Wildlife Management Areas where javelina will be hunted, including the Double E, River Ranch, and Red Rock properties; 3) increasing the bootheel licenses by 10% and increasing the statewide licenses by 20%; 4) modifying season dates for both the bootheel and the statewide hunts: archery - January 1-31 annually; any legal sporting arm - February 1-March 31 annually; 5) removing the ability to hunt javelina during a deer or elk hunt.

**19.31.15.1        ISSUING AGENCY:** New Mexico department of game and fish.

**19.31.15.2        SCOPE:** Sportspersons interested in pronghorn antelope hunting and management. Additional requirements may be found in Chapter 17, NMSA 1978, and Chapters 30, 31, 32 and 33 of Title 19 NMAC.

**19.31.15.3        STATUTORY AUTHORITY:** Sections 17-1-14 and 17-1-26 NMSA 1978 provide that the New Mexico state game commission has the authority to establish rules and regulations that it may deem necessary to carry out the purpose of Chapter 17, NMSA 1978 and all other acts pertaining to protected mammals, birds and fish.

**19.31.15.4        DURATION:** April 1, 2023 through March 31, 2027.

**19.31.15.5        EFFECTIVE DATE:** April 1, 2023, unless a later date is cited at the end of a section.

**19.31.15.6        OBJECTIVE:** Establishing open hunting seasons and regulations, rules, and procedures governing the distribution and issuance of pronghorn licenses by the department.

**19.31.15.7        DEFINITIONS:**

- A.        “Department”** shall mean the New Mexico department of game and fish.
  - B.        “Director”** shall mean the director of the New Mexico department of game and fish.
  - C.        “Either sex” or “ES”** shall mean any one pronghorn.
  - D.        “Female or immature pronghorn” or “F-IM”** shall mean any female pronghorn or any pronghorn with both horns shorter than its ears.
  - E.        “Game management unit” or “GMU”** shall mean those areas as described in 19.30.4 NMAC Game Management Units.
  - F.        “Mature buck pronghorn” or “MB”** shall mean a pronghorn with at least one horn longer than its ears.
  - G.        “Wildlife management areas” or “WMAs”** shall mean those areas as described in 19.34.5 NMAC Wildlife Management Areas.

**19.31.15.8        ADJUSTMENT OF LICENSES, AUTHORIZATIONS AND HARVEST LIMITS:** The director, with the verbal concurrence of the chairperson of the New Mexico state game commission or their designee, may adjust the number of licenses, or authorizations for pronghorn up or down to address significant changes in population levels or to address critical department management needs. This adjustment may be applied to any or all of the specific hunt codes for pronghorn, and may include a limit to the number of private land-only licenses by hunt code. The director may change or cancel all hunts on military lands to accommodate closures on those lands; if changed, the season length and bag limit shall remain the same as assigned on the original hunt code.

**19.31.15.9 PRONGHORN POPULATION MANAGEMENT HUNTS:**

- A.** The director or their designee may authorize population management hunts for pronghorn when justified in writing by department personnel.
- B.** The director or their designee shall designate the sporting arms, season dates, season lengths, bag limits, hunt boundaries, specific requirements or restrictions, and number of licenses or permits to be issued.
- C.** In the event that an applicant is not able to hunt on the dates specified, the applicant's name shall be moved to the bottom of the list and another applicant may be contacted for the hunt.
- D.** In those instances where a population management hunt is warranted on deeded private lands, the landowner may suggest eligible hunters of their choice by submitting a list of prospective hunter's names to the department for licensing consideration. No more than one-half of the total number of licenses authorized shall be available to landowner identified hunters. The balance of prospective hunters shall be identified by the department. **19.31.15.10 SPECIAL PRONGHORN HUNTING OPPORTUNITIES**

- A. Pronghorn conservation recognition program:** Private landowners who are conducting and maintaining substantial habitat improvements and/or land management practices on their deeded lands that directly and significantly benefit pronghorn may be considered for special recognition. Only those projects as determined by the department to be relevant and beneficial to pronghorn will be considered. Landowners must submit an application and once approved, develop a pronghorn conservation and management plan in cooperation with the department. Upon approval of the plan the landowner may be granted alternative season dates as approved by the department. Landowners receiving special recognition are required to submit an update as directed by the department to be considered for continued participation. The hunt code for any unique hunt season approved pursuant to this program shall be ANT-1-600.
- B. Ranch-wide agreements:** Properties consisting of deeded and leased public lands deemed by the department to have pronghorn hunting opportunities may enter into an agreement with the department to create a pronghorn hunting ranch. The boundaries would include both the deeded and leased public lands. The department will negotiate with the landowner the number of private licenses to be issued to landowners with ranch-wide agreements. These private licenses shall have access to the deeded and leased public land within the hunting ranch boundary during the respective pronghorn hunt. The landowner shall allow access to the deeded and leased public land to all legally licensed public draw hunters pursuant to Subsection A of Section 19.31.15.11 NMAC for the respective game management unit. Any ranch entered into such an agreement shall be issued one authorization valid for a free pronghorn license pursuant to 17-3-14 NMSA 1978. [19.31.15.10 NMAC - N, 4/1/2023]

**19.31.15.11 PRONGHORN HUNTS:**

Numbers of licenses are evaluated annually based upon population dynamics, weather conditions, sustainable harvest, and department management objectives.

- A. Public land pronghorn hunts:** Pronghorn draw hunts, listing the open GMUs or areas, eligibility requirements or restrictions, hunt dates, hunt codes, sporting arms type, number of licenses and bag limit shall be as indicated below. Pronghorn draw hunt licenses are valid on all open public lands and any private land the licensee has written permission to hunt within the GMU or area. All WMAs are open to pronghorn hunts in respective GMUs listed in this section unless specifically closed by rule.

**B. Private land-only pronghorn hunts:** Private land-only pronghorn licenses shall be restricted to the hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions, sporting arms type, and bag limit that corresponds to the draw hunt code listed in Subsection A of Section 19.31.15.11 NMAC for the GMU where the private landowner's property lies. Private land-only pronghorn licenses shall be unlimited, except the any legal sporting arms hunt in GMUs 4, 50 and 52 shall be limited to 15 licenses, or as otherwise provided in 19.31.15.8 NMAC, and available from any license vendor and the department's web site. These licenses are not valid for ranch-wide agreement properties as described in Subsection B of Section 19.31.15.10 NMAC. Private land-only pronghorn licenses are valid only on deeded private property where the licensee has written permission to hunt, and within the GMU or area allowed by hunt code, except ranch-wide agreement properties. Private land-only pronghorn licenses are not restricted to only one ranch or property. In those GMUs where there is no pronghorn draw hunt (GMUs 4, 14, 46, 48, 54, and 55), hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions, sporting arms type, and bag limit will be:

**C. Private land-only F-IM pronghorn hunts:** The department will work with interested landowners with sufficient pronghorn populations to authorize F-IM hunts on private deeded land. Sporting arms type, hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions and authorization numbers for private deeded land F-IM hunts will be negotiated to maintain appropriate harvest within the exterior boundaries of participating ranches.

**D. Pronghorn hunt for injured service men and women:** The department may annually issue up to 15 authorizations for hunting by injured service men and women on Melrose Air Force Range. The director shall determine the procedures for issuing the authorizations, and the dates for each hunt.

  - ~~**G.       “Private land only pronghorn license”** shall mean the valid official document for hunting pronghorn on private deeded land during designated private land only hunts.~~
  - ~~**H.       “Unlimited”** shall mean there is no set limit on the number of licenses established for the described hunt areas except as allowed in 19.31.15.8 NMAC.~~
  - ~~**I.       “Web sale”** shall refer to accessing the department’s internet address to initiate the process to purchase specific pronghorn hunting licenses as designated by the director annually.~~
  - GJ.       “Wildlife management areas” or “WMAs”** shall mean those areas as described in 19.34.5 NMAC, Wildlife Management Areas.

**19.31.15.8       ADJUSTMENT OF LICENSES, PERMITS, AUTHORIZATIONS AND HARVEST LIMITS:** The director, with the verbal concurrence of the chairperson of the New Mexico state game commission

or their designee, may adjust the number of licenses, ~~permits~~, or authorizations for pronghorn up or down to address significant changes in population levels or to address critical department management needs. This adjustment may be applied to any or all of the specific hunt codes for pronghorn, and may include a limit to the number of private land-only licenses by hunt code. The director may change or cancel all hunts on military lands to accommodate closures on those lands; if changed, the season length and bag limit shall remain the same as assigned on the original hunt code.

#### **19.31.15.9 PRONGHORN POPULATION MANAGEMENT HUNTS:**

- A.** The director or their designee may authorize population management hunts for pronghorn when justified in writing by department personnel.
  - B.** The director or their designee shall designate the sporting arms, season dates, season lengths, bag limits, hunt boundaries, specific requirements or restrictions, and number of licenses or permits to be issued.
  - C.** In the event that an applicant is not able to hunt on the dates specified, the applicant's name shall be moved to the bottom of the list and another applicant may be contacted for the hunt.
  - D.** In those instances where a population management hunt is warranted on deeded private lands, the landowner may suggest eligible hunters of their choice by submitting a list of prospective hunter's names to the department for licensing consideration. No more than one-half of the total number of licenses authorized shall be available to landowner identified hunters. The balance of prospective hunters shall be identified by the department.

#### **19.31.15.10 SPECIAL PRONGHORN HUNTING OPPORTUNITIES**

- A. Pronghorn conservation recognition program:** Private landowners who are conducting and maintaining substantial habitat improvements and/or land management practices on their deeded lands that directly and significantly benefit pronghorn may be considered for special recognition. Only those projects as determined by the department to be relevant and beneficial to pronghorn will be considered. Landowners must submit an application and once approved, develop a pronghorn conservation and management plan in cooperation with the department. Upon approval of the plan the landowner may be granted alternative season dates as approved by the department. Landowners receiving special recognition are required to submit an update as directed by the department to be considered for continued participation. The hunt code for any unique hunt season approved pursuant to this program shall be ANT-1-600.
  - B. Ranch-wide agreements:** Properties consisting of deeded and leased public lands deemed by the department to have pronghorn hunting opportunities may enter into an agreement with the department to create a pronghorn hunting ranch. The boundaries would include both the deeded and leased public lands. The department will negotiate with the landowner the number of private licenses to be issued to landowners with ranch-wide agreements. These private licenses shall have access to the deeded and leased public land within the hunting ranch boundary during the respective pronghorn hunt. The landowner shall allow access to the deeded and leased public land to all legally licensed public draw hunters pursuant to Subsection A of Section 19.31.15. ~~1143~~ NMAC for the respective game management unit. Any ranch entered into such an agreement shall be issued one authorization valid for a free pronghorn license pursuant to 17-3-14 NMSA 1978.

#### **19.31.15.11 PRONGHORN HUNTS:**

Numbers of licenses are evaluated annually based upon population dynamics, weather conditions, sustainable harvest, and department management objectives.

- A. Public land pronghorn hunts:** Pronghorn draw hunts, listing the open GMUs or areas, eligibility requirements or restrictions, hunt dates, hunt codes, sporting arms type, number of licenses and bag limit shall be as indicated below. Pronghorn draw hunt licenses are valid on all open public lands and any private land the licensee

has written permission to hunt within the GMU or area. All WMAs are open to pronghorn hunts in respective GMUs listed in this section unless specifically closed by rule.

**B. Private land-only pronghorn hunts:** Private land-only pronghorn licenses shall be restricted to the hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions, sporting arms type, and bag limit that corresponds to the draw hunt code listed in Subsection A of Section 19.31.15.11 NMAC for the GMU where the private landowner's property lies. Private land-only pronghorn licenses shall be unlimited, except as provided in 19.31.15.8 NMAC, and available from any license vendor and the department's web site. These licenses are not valid for ranch-wide agreement

properties as described in Subsection B of Section 19.31.15.10 NMAC. Private land-only pronghorn licenses are valid only on deeded private property where the licensee has written permission to hunt, and within the GMU or area allowed by hunt code, except ranch-wide agreement properties. Private land-only pronghorn licenses are not restricted to only one ranch or property. In those GMUs where there is no pronghorn draw hunt (GMUs 4, 14, 46, 48, 54, and 55), hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions, sporting arms type, and bag limit will be:

**C. Private land-only F-IM pronghorn hunts:** The department will work with interested landowners with sufficient pronghorn populations to authorize F-IM hunts on private deeded land. Sporting arms type, hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions and authorization numbers for private deeded land F-IM hunts will be negotiated to maintain appropriate harvest within the exterior boundaries of participating ranches. **D. Pronghorn hunt for injured service men and women:** The department may annually issue up to 15 authorizations for hunting by injured service men and women on Melrose Air Force Range. The director shall determine the procedures for issuing the authorizations, and the dates for each hunt.

The rulemaking was undertaken to adopt a new Pronghorn Antelope Rule, 19.31.15 NMAC, which will become effective April 1, 2023. The current Pronghorn Antelope Rule will expire on March 31, 2023.

The new rule will include:

- 1) Shift hunt structure slightly to begin later in August and have some hunts begin in September and October.
- 2) Create a pronghorn hunt on Melrose Air Force Range in GMU 32.
- 3) Decrease license numbers in the combined hunts in GMUs 2, 7, 9, 10 from 15 bow licenses down to 10 and from 15 any sporting arm licenses down to 5.
- 4) GMU 15: eliminate the 2nd any legal sporting arm hunt but reallocate the 5 licenses to the first any legal sporting arm hunt.
- 5) GMU 16: eliminate the 2nd any legal sporting arm hunt but reallocate the 10 licenses to the remaining hunts.
- 6) Decrease each hunt in GMU 57 by 5 licenses each and moving these licenses to GMU 58.
- 7) Allow pronghorn hunting on Prairie Chicken Areas in the SE part of the state.
- 8) Adjust licenses on McGregor Range from 5 MB non-military and 10 MB military to 7 MB of each.
- 9) Change one of the public muzzle loader hunts in GMUs 50/52 to an any legal sporting arms hunt, decreasing licenses from 40 to 20, and decrease one of the private hunts from unlimited to 15 licenses.

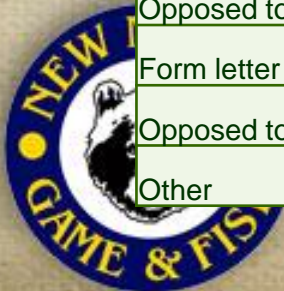

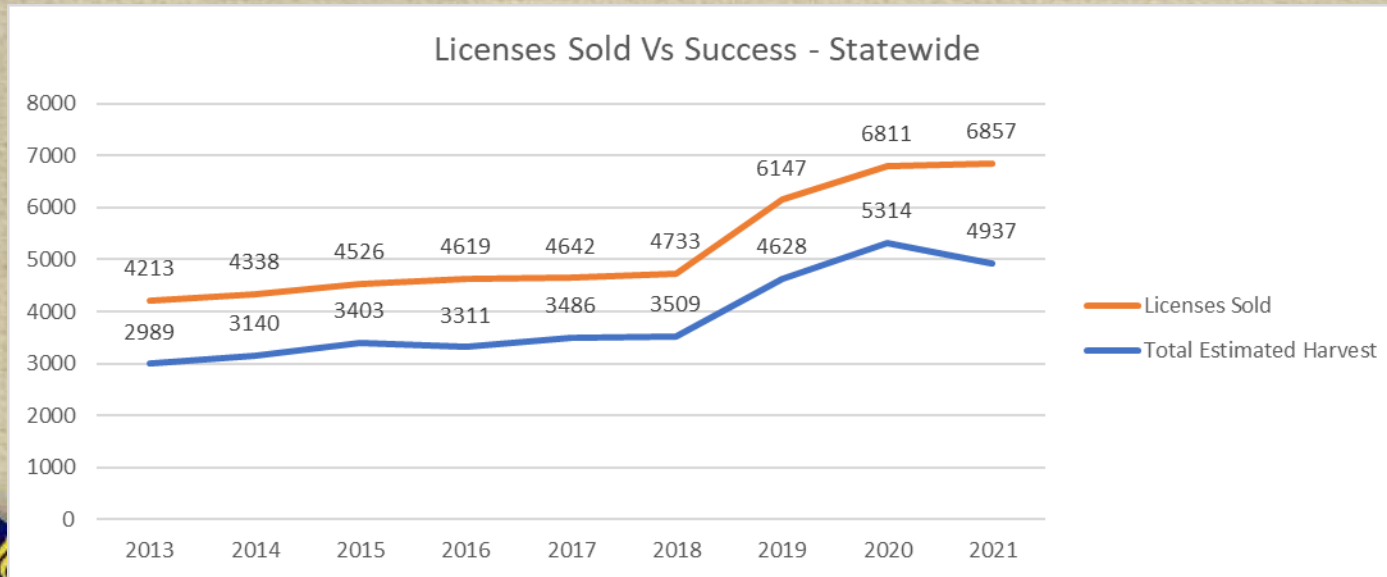

# **PRONGHORN PROPOSED RULE CHANGE SUMMARY (4/11/2022)**

## **PURPOSE**

Maintain sustainable hunting opportunities in New Mexico while maintaining robust populations, based on pronghorn biology and modern population survey techniques.

## **PRONGHORN BIOLOGY**

Pronghorn population growth is driven by both adult female and fawn survival and is typically not greatly affected by male harvest. Compared to deer and elk, pronghorn have shorter lifespans with higher reproductive output. A single male will breed many females within a breeding season, and because pregnancy rates are consistently above 95%, populations remain huntable (unless the number of bucks falls below 10-15 bucks per 100 does). Furthermore, over 99% of the females that are pregnant carry twins. This biological mechanism allows pronghorn populations to respond quickly when conditions are favorable.

Pronghorn reach sexual maturity early in life with horn growth peaking at 2-4 years of age. In contrast, deer are ~5 years of age and elk ~7 years of age when they finally reach their peak trophy potential. Because pronghorn mature rapidly, older-aged males are not required within a pronghorn herd for robust populations or population growth. Additionally, low harvest of males is not necessary to provide quality hunting opportunities.

## **PROPOSED CHANGES TO PRONGHORN HUNTING**

- 1) The Department recommends modifying the definition of a muzzle-loader to include only those muzzle-loading firearms that do not have a scope (for all big game species).
- 2) Shift hunt structure slightly to begin later in August and have some hunts begin in September and October (see hunt table below for proposed dates). This recommendation is to address significant public feedback that pronghorn hunts occur too early and ambient temperatures are too hot.
- 3) Create a pronghorn hunt on Melrose Air Force Range in GMU 32. The Department has been working with Melrose AFR to offer a limited and unique hunting opportunity on Range.
- 4) Due to low pronghorn numbers in the Northwestern quadrant of the state, the Department recommends decreasing license numbers in the combined hunts in GMUs 2, 7, 9, 10 from 15 bow licenses down to 10 and from 15 any sporting arm licenses down to 5.
- 5) To avoid having a conflict of the Department flying elk helicopter surveys over pronghorn hunters in GMUs 15 and 16, we recommend the following;
  - a. GMU 15: eliminate the 2<sup>nd</sup> any legal sporting arm hunt but reallocate the 5 licenses to the first any legal sporting arm hunt.
  - b. GMU 16: eliminate the 2<sup>nd</sup> any legal sporting arm hunt but reallocate the 10 licenses to the remaining hunts (this would increase 2 hunts by 5 licenses each).
- 6) Because of limited access to public land in GMU 57, the Department recommends decreasing each hunt by 5 licenses each and moving these licenses to adjacent GMU 58 that has more public access.
- 7) The Department does not recommend changing the weapon type of the last pronghorn hunt in GMUs 4/50/52 from muzzleloader to any legal weapon. This would leave the hunt with the muzzle-loader weapon type. If the weapon type were to be changed, the Department would have to drastically decrease draw licenses and potentially put a limit on private land licenses as

success rates for any legal weapon are substantially higher and more pronghorn would be harvested. This would be unsustainable for this small population.

- 8) The Department recommends allowing pronghorn hunting on Prairie Chicken Areas in the SE part of the state.
- 9) In coordination with McGregor Range, the Department recommends adjusting licenses from 5 MB non-military and 10 MB military to 7 MB of each.

## Technical Information for Pronghorn Rule Development



### Survey and Harvest Data

A new survey design was implemented in 2015 that uses a Mark Recapture Distance Sampling technique. In addition to allowing the Department to obtain composition ratios, this technique allows for abundance estimation across the landscape. Pronghorn surveys are flown according to Pronghorn Management Unit (PMU; Figure 1) which are delineated by pronghorn population segments in New Mexico and encompass several GMUs. Fixed-wing aerial surveys were conducted in 16 separate PMUs from 2018 through 2021 in July and August of each year; surveys are scheduled for the July-August time frame each year because July is past the period in which the majority of fawn death has occurred but it still allows observers to discern fawns from adults does. Survey intensity has been modified after each year's survey to obtain more accurate estimates of abundance and composition ratios.

The average buck:doe ratio for all PMUs for all years was 49 bucks per 100 does (Table 4; range 14-195 bucks per 100 does). The average fawn ratio for all PMUs for all years was 25 fawns per 100 does (range 0-44 fawns per 100 does). In the 16 separate PMUs that were surveyed, there were an estimated 48,500 – 105,400 pronghorn (Table 6).

Low fawn survival is suspected to be one of the primary causes of pronghorn population declines observed throughout the state. Poor habitat conditions exacerbated by drought are likely the primary cause of the low fawn:doe ratios reported for some PMUs. Fawn:doe ratios are sufficient for sustainable populations throughout much of the state with most PMUs experiencing overall population growth. Significant local variation in observed ratios and differences in fawn survival across the state are likely the result of varying habitat conditions and rainfall levels and timing. Observed buck:doe ratios are sufficient to ensure optimal conception rates and birth timing. Disparity in sex ratios is likely the result of differing natural limiting factors and variable hunting pressures. Differences in probability of detection for bucks, does, and fawns may also have impacted results from one location to another. The survey results suggest that pronghorn abundance and fawn survival remain substantially higher in the northeastern portion of New Mexico compared with other regions. The southeastern region of the state contains the second highest population with the southwest having the 3<sup>rd</sup> most pronghorn. Although the population in the northwestern region of the state remains healthy and sustainable, this region holds the fewest pronghorn of any region. The Tres Piedras pronghorn population is a high elevation population that is separated from other pronghorn populations by high mountain ranges.

We spot and stalk and there have been times when we got back to a vehicle and then relocated the animal that some of the meat was less than yummy and had a funk to it. It was wasted!

Because of that we have had to change the way we hunt to using the vehicle more now and it truly detracts from the quality of the hunt. At 65 and still able to hunt on foot I really am disappointed in the fact that we can't hunt pronghorn that way anymore. We typically pitch tents & sleep on the ground and do most things in a modern pioneer way and like it that way.

Dear Commissioners

I have hunted New Mexico for many years both for elk and pronghorn and maintain a longstanding hunting ranch lease in Socorro County and also utilize an outfitter in the Northeastern part of the state for both elk and pronghorn hunting. Our company, Boyt Harness, usually brings between five and ten hunters each year to New Mexico hunting at an annual cost expenditure that is upwards of \$100,000 and sometimes higher depending on the hunts and number of hunters we bring.

From a pure economic standpoint, combining pronghorn seasons with the elk season is going to vastly reduce the number of trips made by non-resident hunters to the state who would normally travel during two different months, combining the seasons into one time frame will deprive your local merchants, hotels, restaurants, airlines and gas stations of millions of dollars of revenue. That's not an exaggeration, we are only one small company and look at what we spend!

These monies help employ thousands of New Mexico taxpayers and it would be fiscally irresponsible for the commission to combine the seasons from an economic impact if nothing else.

Personally, I also believe that the incidence of "opportunity poaching" would increase exponentially as historically has been shown to happen when two seasons cross into each other but the offending violator has a tag for only one species. When the system was changed four years ago it was bad enough and I have witnessed on our property the poaching of antelope by "hunters" who buy a private land tag where there are no antelope and then shoot them without permission on ranches where there are antelope. Your wardens have made cases on our ranch lease (Cat Mountain) and we also found evidence on numerous occasions where it was too late to prosecute.

In all instances, it is the pronghorn resource that has suffered the most.

Under the old system when the draw hunters were able to hunt private land and state during the September seasons, we had a system that worked and offered tremendous opportunities for everyone, not to mention the trophy class pronghorn bucks were allowed to rut unmolested before the seasons opened.

I plead that the commission go back to those rules or something similar and please do not combine any pronghorn seasons with an October elk season in any units, northeast or otherwise.

My concern is that hunters, with the modern in-line muzzleloaders, will take long distance shots whether they have a scope or not. I'd much rather have somebody with a scope hit the vitals than make a non lethal hit trying to do it with iron sites. Maybe I should have more faith in people showing restraint with shot selection, I just know too many good people that get a little excited in the moment and don't make good decisions. I'm not sure if this is a fair chase concern or too high of harvest rates for muzzy hunts....Perhaps we could think about lowering available tags, or changing muzzleloader season to less prime dates, or grouping muzzleloader hunts near rifle hunts. Just wanted to throw this out since I won't be able to attend the June 3rd meetins.

If the purpose of the rule is to increase permits by doing away with scopes, then why muzzleloaders chosen and not compound bows. Why muzzleloaders and not rifle scopes, that go out to 24 power and so on? if you google muzzleloader scopes, you will find that scopes were invented in 1740 and mounted onto muzzleloaders back then. The scopes on muzzleloaders have been around for almost 300 years. Scratch the debate about primitive weapons and keeping them primitive.

My next question is simple, and this is the explanation. I am 74 years old, have bad eyesight, need reading glasses and when I shoot an open sighted muzzleloader, even with glasses, I cannot focus the back sight, the front sight, and the target properly. Bottom line is that I have a visual disability and I can produce documentation from a doctor to state that I do not have 20/20 vision and need glasses. If the director gives reasonable accommodations to people with disabilities or injuries, such as to compound bow hunter that has a bad rotator cuff, so that they cannot pull back a compound bow and are allowed to hunt with a crossbow, can I expect to receive a reasonable accommodation because of my disability eyesight and be allowed to use a scope on a muzzleloader. I hunt with a scope, so that I can see better, place my shot more ethically and respect the animal. It has nothing to do with increasing range, it is about being more ethical toward the animal and the harvest.

This debate, to me is a back door way to do away with scopes, by someone in the Department or public, that does not like scopes on muzzleloaders. If the Commission wants to provide more opportunity for hunters, then let's do away with scopes. So that you do not discriminate against one group of hunters let's put some restrictions on the archery hunters and the rifle hunters also. After all it is about more permits and more opportunity. Maybe we should make pistols with no scopes, after all they are legal weapons? Let's only allow 0 to 4 power scopes on rifles and no higher. That takes out the long range shooters,

the want to be long range shooters. Let's only allow Compound bows with a let off 30% instead of let off of 70%. Let's do away with lighted sights and releases and go back to the old use of the fingers. If the muzzleloader accounts for 25% harvest and the rifle hunter accounts for 40%, as stated, then let's cut them all back so that everyone gets more opportunity. This smells so much of discrimination against one class of hunters, that it is obvious what the Department is up to.

In summary do it all or none and don't allow a back door way to do away with scopes.

State Game Commissioners,

I am providing comment to the proposal to not allow scope on muzzleloaders.

I am totally aware that modern muzzleloaders have evolved to be a very effective hunting implement the last 20 years, especially with a telescopic sights (scope). Other hunting implements such as bows and rifles with modern scopes have also advanced to be very effective to harvest game animals at extended ranges.

I must say, that's what is preached at Hunter Ed. Hunters are to harvest their game as humanely as possible. Regardless of what legal method or stage you decide to hunt with, you should be as proficient as possible. That's the case with modern scoped muzzleloaders. These implements have allowed hunting to be successful. The New Mexico Department of Game & Fish (NMDGF) depends on hunters to be successful and harvest game animals to manage their populations. Instead of managing a successful method, the NMDGF should consider managing licenses to the desired number they want harvested.

I'm afraid that this will not end here. If we start managing the method, then future proposals from the NMDGF may manage other methods of harvesting big game. For example the 30/06 Springfield rifle cartridge is very effective in harvesting big game. Perhaps future proposals may suggest not using a 30/06 for hunting elk because harvest rates are too high. Where will this stop? We could go on and on with other great advancements in hunting gear and implements that make hunters more successful in the field.

Not allowing scopes on muzzleloaders will like mean perceived lower success rates. I say perceived because it is very likely that more game will be wounded. Scope simply allow a hunter to be more precise and effective in harvesting game. An example of this would that GMU 50/52 muzzleloader pronghorn hunt. Muzzleloader hunting those pronghorn without a scope will likely result in less than desired harvest rate and a lot of wounded antelope. Perhaps the NMDGF should consider allowing scoped muzzleloaders on this type of hunt (only) and other hunts for big games that are more difficult with open terrain. Just a thought. One size doesn't fit all.

Also, allowing scopes on muzzleloaders makes hunting them safer. Scopes may allow a hunter to properly identify/verify their target and what's beyond. I'm not suggesting that a muzzleloader hunter use their telescopic site identify their target, that's what their binos are for. However, scopes will allow for a much safer and ethical shot on game. This past fall there was a hunting accident in Colorado where a muzzleloader hunter without a scope mistakenly shot another hunter because they were mistaken for game. I can't help to think that this tragic accident could of been mitigated if the muzzleloader hunter would have had a telescopic sight to assist in verifying the target.

Lastly, why am I commenting on this proposal to not allow scope on muzzleloaders? I own several muzzleloaders with scopes. I need a scope in my muzzleloader. With my aging eyes, I can't sent open sights anymore. I tried everything, including glasses and bi focal glasses. Sure I could continue to use a scoped muzzleloader during/for a any legal firearms hunt. That's not the point I'm trying convey. My point is not to try to manage the tool or method, manage the amount of licenses. That's Wildlife Management at its finest and purest form.

That said, please consider to define a muzzleloader to include a scope if a hunter chooses to be more safe and effective to harvest game ethically.

So ya I hate August hunts but I don't agree with changing dates.

Reasons:

1. Archery hunts for antelope have always been in the 1st week of August, Assuming the complainers are the rifle hunters, those dates are ones that had changed to August.
2. Its really the south units that were affected, North units again were always that last week of August.
3. With elk in Sept/Oct and deer in Nov, starts to get crowded with trying to fit antelope in there and being a guide can make it hard to do all these different hunts in different areas at the same time. It is kind of nice to have August for Antelope then move to elk for Sept/Oct, then deer in Nov. Unless you are planning to move antelope in December I would prefer it stay where its at now. Maybe push it back a week or 2 but would not want them encroaching too much in Sept.
4. Antelope is not only hunts in August, look at some oryx hunts. If changing antelope then it's too hot for oryx too, we should move those hunts too or not do them.
5. I always thought they moved hunts to space them out for game officers to control certain areas. Moving an antelope hunt to conflict with other animals will spread them even thinner then what they are now.
6. If you are moving dates, I think private only hunts should be allowed to hunt over a span of like 2-3 weeks like it use to be. That would help the conflict with elk and deer that always start on a weekend. Allowing private to hunt in between these hunts.

I hate the heat and trust me, I don't care for the August hunts, but I just deal with it. And honestly most antelope hunts are done by noon, so how many people are really out hunting at the hottest point of day? Those are probably the ones complaining and probably the ones that are not good hunters to be done early like the rest of us. Antelope hunts are not that hard.

So I would say I am opposed to messing with dates, other then maybe a week later. I think they actually work the way they are.

The current rule is unbalanced with regard to private land owners/ranchers having permit advantages over the general public.

1. Public draw antelope licenses have decreased disproportionately to the total number of licenses issued since the last rule revision - a higher percentage of total licenses are going to private land hunters.
2. Land locked public land( both state and federal) without legal access has become part of a ranchers "property" with regard to antelope hunting. Antelope hunters with private land only tags are realistically unregulated with regard to hunting and harvesting antelope on these inaccessible public parcels.
3. Issuing unlimited tags to private land owners abrogates the NMDGF's responsibility to manage wild populations.
4. I suggest a thorough review of the existing rule, its impact on public draw hunt opportunities, an analysis of compliance and enforcement of private land hunters knowing and respecting public land parcels, and ways to more appropriately balance public/private tags on ranches with mixed land ownership and no legal public access.
5. I favor returning to the prior system of apportionment of tags based upon percentages of land ownership e.g. biologists recommend a ranch has a sustainable 10 antelope harvest, the ranch is 70% private land and 30% public - rancher gets 7 tags and 3 tags are in the public draw.

As an older hunter, I utilize my scope to make an ethical shot on an animal, as it allows me to see much more clearly where to place my shot before pulling the trigger. I do not personally own what you consider a long range muzzleloader, mine is an older TC Encore, which I feel comfortable shooting up to 200 yards with the scope. We have experimented and found the best amount of powder, as well as the best bullet to use to make it very accurate, but I have always utilized the scope when shooting it. I believe making the most ethical shot on an animal is the most important aspect for any weapon, and I also believe that there will be many more wounded animals that later die, that won’t be counted in your harvest reports that will go to waste if this rule is adopted, and populations will still decrease more than you desire due to unrecovered game animals that end up dying. Hello,

I just received the email about proposals for Pronghorn, Bighorn and Javelina and wanted to give my comment.

For bighorn sheep, the Department is seeking input on several management considerations across the state including: opening the Jemez population to ram hunting; separating the Hatchets hunt to spread hunters across the mountain range; splitting the Ladron and Peloncillo hunts into two hunt periods to distribute hunters; and adding a third hunt window for rams in the Rio Grande Gorge.

I'm in favor of these sheep proposals. Anything that will give more tags and new places to hunt I'm in favor for Bighorns.

For javelina, the Department is seeking input on possible increases in total licenses and season lengths, and expanding the areas javelina can be hunted to include some Wildlife Management Areas.

I'm NOT in favor of giving more tags. Seems to me right now that tags are pretty easy to draw and there is a huge OTC area, so opportunity isn't a problem. I haven't seen any clear population evidence from the department to warrant more tags given, I'd like to see that. Javelina don't reproduce at high levels, so I think overharvest could be a problem. I don't know what WMA's are being considered to be open, but I'm in favor for more access anywhere we can.

Not listed in your Javelina proposals is making them part of the Waste of Games Laws. I know that has to go through the legislature, but I really think the Department should be pushing that. It's a moral travesty that hunters are allowed to shoot a Javelina, punch their tag and then just leave that Javelina laying there without taking any part

of the animal out of the field. It's not like Javelina are a predator species that need to be controlled. Again, I know this is legislative but I feel more could be done here. The MeatEater guy even had a facebook post about this, so it's not like it's an unknown issue.

For pronghorn, the Department is seeking input on moving hunt dates later in the season based on public feedback that the current season (August, annually) is quite hot and not ideal for hunting pronghorn. The Department also anticipates proposing small adjustments to license numbers.

Yes! I'm definitely in favor of this. August is just a rough time to hunt because of the heat. I'm sure there are lots of Pronghorn meat spoiling on these hunts and also capes are just not as pretty. Also makes it tough to do long stalks or hikes in the heat. I would like to see the seasons in mid to late September or very early October. Would be nice if they are before the Muzzleloader or Rifle elk hunts, just incase you drew both and there was a conflict in having available time to hunt both animals. I know the elk and deer bow hunts are in September, but usually those seasons are pretty long. So if you got lucky and drew a Pronghorn and a Bow elk tag, you should be able to squeeze that Pronghorn hunt in. Lastly, I know Game Warden availability is also a consideration. I would think between the end of Bow season to the beginning of Muzzy Elk season would be a good time for that.

Thanks so much for taking my comments! Look forward to hearing presentations on these.

### 1. Summary of Agenda Item

The Department will present biological data and proposed amendments to the Pronghorn Rule (19.31.15 NMAC) based on public feedback, biological information, and management goals. The Department held 2 virtual public meetings and also received public comments on the Pronghorn rule.

Proposed changes include:

- Shift hunt structure slightly to begin later in August and have some hunts begin in September and October. This recommendation is to address significant public feedback that pronghorn hunts occur too early and ambient temperatures are too hot.
- Create an injured service member pronghorn hunt on Melrose Air Force Range in GMU 32.
- Due to low pronghorn numbers in the Northwestern quadrant of the state, the Department recommends decreasing license numbers in the combined hunts in GMUs 2, 7, 9, 10 from 15 bow licenses down to 10 and from 15 any sporting arm licenses down to 5.
- To avoid having a conflict of the Department flying elk helicopter surveys over pronghorn hunters in GMUs 15 and 16, we recommend the following:
  - o GMU 15: eliminate the 2nd any legal sporting arm hunt but reallocate the 5 licenses to the first any legal sporting arm hunt.
  - o GMU 16: eliminate the 2nd any legal sporting arm hunt but reallocate the 10 licenses to the remaining hunts (this would increase 2 hunts by 5 licenses each).
- Because of limited access to public land in GMU 57, the Department recommends decreasing each hunt by 5 licenses each and moving these licenses to adjacent GMU 58 that has more public access.
- No change to the weapon type of the last pronghorn hunt in GMUs 4/50/52. The Department proposes to keep this as a muzzleloader hunt based on public comment against changing the weapon type.
- Small adjustments to license numbers

### 2. Background Information

The pronghorn rule (19.31.15 NMAC) is re-evaluated every 4 years and changed based on public feedback, population data, harvest data, and management goals. The Department has held public meetings and has received public input.

During the last Big Game Rule Cycle in 2018 significant changes were made to the pronghorn rule due to the elimination of the Antelope Private Land Use System (APLUS) program. This change resulted in more male hunting opportunity by increasing the number of licenses in the public draw approximately 22% and allowing over-the-counter purchase of buck licenses on private deeded land. The resulting change was increasing resident pronghorn license sales by 46%

Pronghorn hunting is largely centered on male harvest with greater than 91% of the annual harvest being males, as such the statewide pronghorn population growth is not limited by hunting.

There has been concern voiced since the last rule was implemented that pronghorn hunt dates were too early (August). Therefore, based on public comment received thus far the Department is proposing moving some hunt dates later in the season as outlined above. Hunt dates will not have a biological impact on the population and should not impact harvest success rates.

The director may change or cancel all hunts on military lands to accommodate closures on those lands; if changed, the season length and bag limit shall remain the same as assigned on the original hunt code.

**C.** In the event that an applicant is not able to hunt on the dates specified, the applicant’s name shall be moved to the bottom of the list and another applicant may be contacted for the hunt.

**D.** In those instances where a population management hunt is warranted on deeded private lands, the landowner may suggest eligible hunters of their choice by submitting a list of prospective hunter’s names to the department for licensing consideration. No more than one-half

of the total number of licenses authorized shall be available to landowner identified hunters. The balance of prospective hunters shall be identified by the department.

#### 19.31.15.10 SPECIAL PRONGHORN HUNTING OPPORTUNITIES

**A. Pronghorn conservation recognition program:** Private landowners who are conducting and maintaining substantial habitat improvements and/or land management practices on their deeded lands that directly and significantly benefit pronghorn may be considered for special recognition. Only those projects as determined by the department to be relevant and beneficial to pronghorn will be considered. Landowners must submit an application and once approved, develop a pronghorn conservation and management plan in cooperation with the department. Upon approval of the plan the landowner may be granted alternative season dates as approved by the department. Landowners receiving special recognition are required to submit an update as directed by the department to be considered for continued participation. The hunt code for any unique hunt season approved pursuant to this program shall be ANT-1-600.

**B. Ranch-wide agreements:** Properties consisting of deeded and leased public lands deemed by the department to have pronghorn hunting opportunities may enter into an agreement with the department to create a pronghorn hunting ranch. The boundaries would include both the deeded and leased public lands. The department will negotiate with the landowner the number of private licenses to be issued to landowners with ranch-wide agreements. These private licenses shall have access to the deeded and leased public land within the hunting ranch boundary during the respective pronghorn hunt. The landowner shall allow access to the deeded and leased public land to all legally licensed public draw hunters pursuant to Subsection A of Section 19.31.15.1143 NMAC for the respective game management unit. Any ranch entered into such an agreement shall be issued one authorization valid for a free pronghorn license pursuant to 17-3-14 NMSA 1978.

Numbers of licenses are evaluated annually based upon population dynamics, weather conditions, sustainable harvest, and department management objectives.

Public land pronghorn hunts:** Pronghorn draw hunts, listing the open GMUs or areas, eligibility requirements or restrictions, hunt dates, hunt codes, sporting arms type, number of licenses and bag limit shall be as indicated below. Pronghorn draw hunt licenses are valid on all open public lands and any private land the licensee has written permission to hunt within the GMU or area. All WMAs are open to pronghorn hunts in respective GMUs listed in this section unless specifically closed by rule.

**B. Private land-only pronghorn hunts:** Private land-only pronghorn licenses shall be restricted to the hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions, sporting arms type, and bag limit that corresponds to the draw hunt code listed in Subsection A of Section 19.31.15.11 NMAC for the GMU where the private landowner's property lies. Private land-only pronghorn licenses shall be unlimited, except as provided in 19.31.15.8 NMAC, and available from any license vendor and the department's web site. These licenses are not valid for ranch-wide agreement properties as described in Subsection B of Section 19.31.15.10 NMAC. Private land-only pronghorn licenses are valid only on deeded private property where the licensee has written permission to hunt, and within the GMU or area allowed by hunt code, except ranch-wide agreement properties. Private land-only pronghorn licenses are not restricted to only one ranch or property. In those GMUs where there is no pronghorn draw hunt (GMUs 4, 14, 46, 48, 54, and 55), hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions, sporting arms type, and bag limit will be:

**C. Private land-only F-IM pronghorn hunts:** The department will work with interested landowners with sufficient pronghorn populations to authorize F-IM hunts on private deeded land. Sporting arms type, hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions and

authorization numbers for private deeded land F-IM hunts will be negotiated to maintain appropriate harvest within the exterior boundaries of participating ranches.

**D. Pronghorn hunt for injured service men and women:** The department may annually issue up to 15 authorizations for hunting by injured service men and women on Melrose Air Force Range. The director shall determine the procedures for issuing the authorizations, and the dates for each hunt.
