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MR. LOPEZ: We'll move onto our next agenda item, which is the Migratory Game Bird Rule NMAC 19.31.6.

Okay. This chamber, please come to order. My name is Tirzio Lopez, vice chair of for the Commission. I'll be serving as the hearing monitor and (indiscernible) of Commissioner's counsel of the Office of the Attorney General.

The purpose of this hearing is for the Commission to receive public comment on repealing and replacing the Migratory Game Bird Rule, Title 19, Chapter 31, Part 6 (indiscernible) on April 1st, 2023. These hearings are conducted with (indiscernible) provisions of the Game & Fish Act and the State Bird Act. The hearing is also being audiotaped and video recorded. Anyone interested in a copy of the audio or video tape shall contact (indiscernible) with the New Mexico Department of Game & Fish.

Public notice of this hearing was advertised in the New Mexico Register, the New Mexico Sunshine portal, and (indiscernible). Copies of the proposal (indiscernible) have been available on the Department's website. No addition to (indiscernible) to submit public comments (indiscernible).

Staff will present (indiscernible) exhibits. Exhibits that have been entered that have been entered into evidence are available for review by the public on the Department's

1	website. After all exhibits are entered, we will proceed
2	with the presentation of the (indiscernible) after which
3	testimony will be taken from the audience.
4	Note that the (indiscernible).
5	MR. RUBIN: Mr. Vice-Chairman, members of the
6	Commission, I do wish to submit some exhibits into the
7	record.
8	Exhibit number 1 is a copy of the Department's rule
9	and what we did in the summary to the notice to the
10	records.
11	Exhibit 2 is the presentation I'll be giving today.
12	Exhibit 3: public comments we received during the
13	rule process rule making process.
14	Exhibit 4: the technical information we relied upon
15	to develop the rule.
16	And Exhibit 6 (sic): a copy of the (indiscernible).
17	MALE SPEAKER: Is there an Exhibit 5 (indiscernible)?
18	MR. LOPEZ: I think he meant 5.
19	MR. RUBIN: I meant 5. I must have I apologize.
20	MALE SPEAKER: Okay.
21	MR. RUBIN: Yeah.
22	MALE SPEAKER: And Mr. Rubin, is there a are we
23	putting into the record the certificate that reflects the
24	notice was given to the public?



MR. RUBIN: Yes, that was Exhibit number 1.

4	MR. LOPEZ: (Indiscernible).
5	MR. RUBIN: So again, this is the final portion of
6	this rule-making hearing. We (indiscernible) in accordance
7	with the Fish and Wildlife Service with the federal
8	frameworks. You've heard these at the last couple of
9	meetings. We adjusted the bag limits, possession limits,
10	dates according to what's allowable in the federal register
11	as well.
12	This is an annual rule-making hearing, and what we're
13	doing here is we're planning on changes to the regular
14	migratory bird seasons based off on public comments and
15	dates. And then we will also, with that, there's no
16	changes in the (indiscernible) permit numbers.
17	We have (indiscernible) bag limit that's going to
18	remain at one for this upcoming migratory bird season.
19	That's in accordance with the federal regulations.
20	And then no changes to the dove seasons.
21	We did receive public comments five public comments
22	received to the rule hearing. We did have two public
23	meetings or excuse, a hybrid public meeting, and that
24	was on April 26th. Two members of the public did attend.

The comments we received, some of them are not

applicable, because they would take federal action. It's not action you all can take, such as duck (indiscernible) requirements, north and south zone opening days, for example, on our season (indiscernible).

And then also, we have a comment on shifting the snipe season to later. That's something that we can take into account for the next rule cycle. That will be -- would take federal action, but we would work with the federal government to potentially look at that for next season. But for this season, the frameworks would not allow all of that.

And so I can go through the specific dates, if you wish, but you all have heard this at two previous meetings. So with that, I would take any questions that you all may have.

MR. LOPEZ: Would anyone like to comment (indiscernible) as to 19.31.6?

FEMALE SPEAKER: Mr. Vice-Chair, I would like to say thank you to the Department of Gaming & Fish for the work that they've done in making these proposed changes, but I would also like to thank the members of the public for expressing their comments and coming forward.
