1	MR. LOPEZ: Okay. We'll go on to our next agenda
2	item, and that is our fisheries rule, 9.31.4 NMAC hearing.
3	We have Dr. Patten.
4	(Pause)
5	MR. LOPEZ: Is the doctor ready?
6	DR. PATTEN: (Indiscernible).
7	MR. LOPEZ: We're going to have the open hearing now
8	for the New Mexico fishing rule. This hearing will please
9	come to order. My name is Tirzio Lopez, vice-chair to the
10	commission. I will be serving as the hearing officer and
11	be advised by the Commission's Council from the Office of
12	the Attorney General.
13	The purpose of this hearing is for the Commission to
14	receive comments on amending the fishing rule, Title 19,
15	Chapter 31, Part 4, New Mexico Administrative Code, and
16	shall become effective September 12th, 2023.
17	These hearings are being conducted in accordance with
18	the provision of the Game and Fish Act (phonetic) and the
19	State Rules Act. These hearings are to be audiotaped and
20	video recorded. Anyone interested in a copy of the
21	audiotape or video recording should contact Ryan Darr with
22	the New Mexico Game and Fish Department.
23	Public notice of this hearing has been advertised in
24	the New Mexico Register and the New Mexico Sunshine Portal

on the Department's website. Copies of the proposed

amendments have been available on the Department website.

Those wishing to comment here today must have registered to submit public comments.

The rule hearing will be conducted in the following manner. Staff will present pre-filed exhibits; exhibits admitted into evidence are available for review by the public on the Department's website. After all exhibits are entered, we will proceed with the presentation of a proposal, after which testimony has been given from the audience. Participants are asked to wait until they have been called upon to speak.

In order to ensure that this hearing is accurately recorded, only one person at a time shall be allowed to speak. Any person recognized to speak is asked to identify yourself by name, who you are affiliated with, for the record, each time you are recognized, and speak loud and clear to accurately record your comments.

After a person has offered comment they will stand for questions from the hearing officer. The audience may be also asked questions from anyone offering comments, being recognized by me. These hearings are subject -- are not subject to the additional rules of evidence; however, in the interest of efficiency, I reserve the right to limit any testimony deemed irrelevant, redundant, or unduly repetitious.

The Commission may discuss the purposed rule after the public comment portion of the hearing. Final Commission action, including adoption of the rule, may occur after the conclusion of the presentation and the public comment period for this hearing.

This hearing is now open. Are there any exhibits for the proposed amendments to 19.31.4 NMAC for the records?

DR. PATTEN: Good morning, Mr. Vice-Chair and Commissioners. Yes, I have six exhibits I'd like to enter into the hearing record. Mr. Vice-Chair, I'm going to go ahead and read what the exhibits are, just for the record.

The first of these is Exhibit 1. It is a notice of proposed rulemaking for notifying the public of this hearing. The second is a redline and clean version of the proposed rule. The third exhibit is a copy of technical information from which will be relied upon, and it includes House Bill 197. The fourth exhibit is a summary of the purposed changes. Exhibit 5 is a copy of one public comment we received, and Exhibit 6 is a copy of this presentation.

MR. LOPEZ: Exhibits 1 through 6 are admitted into the record.

16	MR. LOPEZ: Kirk, can you please introduce the
17	purposed amendments to 19.31.4?
18	DR. PATTEN: Thank you, Mr. Vice-chair. Yes, I can do
19	so.
20	Like you said, I'm here to present a brief overview of
21	amendments minor amendments to the fisheries rule
22	related to free fishing days. As the current structure of
23	the rule states, free fishing days are designated in
24	19.31.4.16 (indiscernible), as the first Saturday of June
25	each year and the last Saturday of each of of September

of each year.

House Bill 197 was passed during the last legislative session and signed into law. It expanded the director's authority to designate free fishing days — two non-consecutive free fishing days per year, with Commission approval, to two non-consecutive free fishing weekends.

And so we came to you -- I believe it was at your April meeting, and presented concepts of how we were purposing to enact this to try and get a free fishing weekend in this year, in 2023.

After discussions, we decided to make the proposal that we would come up with, stick with the same sort of structure of the first weekend in June of each year and the last weekend in September of each year. A little bit of change there is related to the first; you could have a Sunday — a Sunday being the first day of the month and then the Saturday being the next day of the month, so we went with the first consecutive Saturday and Sunday of each — of June, and the last consecutive Saturday and Sunday of September. This aligns with National Fish and Boating Week or days that the National Fish and Boat Foundation puts on, so it's the same sort of structure we've been using, just changing it to weekends.

We received one public comment on this proposal; it wasn't really relevant to the topic at hand, and if the



1	Commission chooses to pass this proposed amendment today,
2	we are prepared to file the paperwork, and it will go into
3	effect, and we will have our first free fishing weekend in
4	September of this year.
5	Thank you for your time, and that's all I have today.
6	MALE SPEAKER: Thank you, sir.
7	MR. LOPEZ: Would anyone like to comment on purposed
8	amendment 19.31.4, free fishing rule?
9	MS. HICKEY: Mr. Vice-Chair, Commissioners, I'd like
10	to move to amend fisheries rule 19.31.4.16
11	MR. LOPEZ: Hold on. I've got to close the hearing.
12	MS. HICKEY: Oh. I'm sorry.
13	MR. LOPEZ: We got you though. We're going to get
14	you.
