




La Fragua Re-Route, Carson NF, OG.159



Information: The La Fragua Re-route was opened in 2018 on the Jicarilla District of the Carson National Forest. The partnership to complete this project included Open Gate, the US Forest Service, Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, US Fish and Wildlife Service, and the Carson National Forest Road Committee. The project regained vehicle access to more than 11,000 acres in Game Management Unit 2B which provides excellent habitat for deer and other species.

Habitat: Pinyon-Juniper Woodland and sagebrush in the lower elevations transitioning to Ponderosa Pine and mixed forest in the higher elevations.

Purpose: The purpose of this project is to provide access for properly licensed and license-exempt sportspersons on and through the US Forest Service lands in the Jicarilla District of the Carson National Forest.

Permitted Activities: The general public may travel the La Fragua re-route for entering and exiting legally-accessible US Forest Service lands as specified in the agreement between the Department of Game and Fish and the US Forest Service. Access to this property is subject to the terms and conditions specified by the US Forest Service and is restricted to the following activities:

Open Gate is a program that leases private lands to improve public access for hunting, fishing, and trapping. Open Gate leases are funded exclusively by hunters, anglers, and trappers through the purchase of the Habitat Management and Access Validation (HMAV).





