

Indoor Air Gun Range Rules

1. Follow the basic air gun safety rules
 - a. Only .177 pellets are allowed on the range
 - b. Treat every air gun as if it were loaded
 - c. Always keep the muzzle of air gun pointed in a safe direction
 - d. Keep your finger off the trigger and out of the trigger guard until you are ready to shoot.
2. Everyone utilizing the Indoor Air Gun Range is required to wear eye protection.
3. Do not load a pellet into the chamber of the air gun you are using until you are at your shooting station and preparing to fire.
4. Air guns shall be carried pointed in a safe direction – up or down, with the action open and both the chamber and magazine empty when a shooter is not on a shooting station.
5. The use of any drug, legal or illegal and including alcohol, prior to or during shooting is prohibited, with the exception of prescription or non-prescription over-the-counter medications that do not impair a shooter's ability to shoot safely.
6. No food will be permitted in the firing line area. Drinks are permitted only in resealable containers.
7. If your gun malfunctions or misfires, keep muzzle pointed down range. Send someone to get the RSO.
8. Poor sportsmanship will not be tolerated and may result in removal from the range.
