General Clovis Wing Shooting Complex and Archery Range Rules

Restrictions

The following are strictly prohibited on Clovis Wing Shooting Complex and Archery Range property:

- 1. ALL CELL PHONES SILENT. To be courteous to all shooters concentrating on hitting their target on the range, all cell phones are to be placed on silent.
- 2. No illegal firearms.
- 3. No shooting at wildlife.
- 4. No shooting cross-range.
- 5. Smoking is NOT permitted in any facility and while shooting or waiting to shoot.
- 6. Shooters may NOT consume alcoholic beverages or drugs (including prescription and over-the-counter medications) that will affect his or her ability to participate with a maximum state of awareness and in a completely safe manner, before or during live fire activities. The Range Officer will deny range access to anyone that is or appears to be in violation.
- 7. No bullet impacts off the range, into buildings, signs, storage containers, sheds or any other structure or range feature not a Clovis Wing Shooting Complex and Archery Range approved impact area.
- 8. No disruptive activities, such as loud music or children that are not supervised properly on the firing line.
- 9. No loaded firearms are allowed on the Clovis Wing Shooting Complex and Archery Range property other than on the Firing Line and designated Firing Areas.
- 10. All Guns must be carried unloaded with the breach/action open.
- 11. Everyone must wear eye and hearing protection on the range to include spectators.

Allowable Firearms

- 1. Only 12 gauge or smaller Shotguns are allowed.
- 2. Shot size #7 $\frac{1}{2}$ 9 is allowed.

Range Rules

The rules for using the range are outlined as follows, along with noting any unique rules.

Liability Waiver and Age Restrictions

All users of the Clovis Wing Shooting Complex and Archery Range must fill out and sign a liability waiver annually that they use the range. New cycle will begin 1 January of each year.

- See the "Children On The Range" section below for children under the age of 18
- Clovis Wing Shooting Complex and Archery Range rules on age and gun possession are in line with federal and state laws.

General Range Rules

- 1. Everyone is required to adhere to the written Range Safety Operating Procedures (SOP).
- 2. Always keep the gun pointed in a safe direction.
- 3. Always keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot.
- 4. Always keep the gun unloaded until ready to use.
- 5. Know how to use the gun safely
 - a. Shooters need to know how the gun operates, its basic parts, how to safely open and close the action, and how to remove ammunition.
- 6. All scheduled event use of the range shall take precedence over any individual or personal activity NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 7. All vehicles shall be parked in the designated parking area, unless authorized by the Clovis Wing Shooting Complex and Archery Range management.
- 8. Range is to be used as posted, or as directed by the RSO on duty.
- 9. All shooters and spectators on the firing lines and staging areas must wear ear and eye protection.
- 10. ALL firearms must be unloaded, cased, or actions open when taken to and from the firing line.
- 11. When a "Cease Fire" is called by an RSO, stop all shooting and wait for instruction from the RSO.
- 12. Firing in a careless manner will not be tolerated. Those individuals firing in a careless manner will be dismissed from the range for the rest of the day.
- 13. All children under 18 must be under adult supervision at all times while inside the range perimeter. Any adult supervising a child will not be allowed to shoot on the range leaving the child unsupervised.
- 14. Keep your area used clean. Please respect the equipment and clean up your area when you are through shooting. If you move something, PUT IT BACK. If you break something, REPORT IT so it can be repaired for future use.

Children On the Range

- 1. Children under the age of 18 will not be allowed on the firing range without adult supervision from an adult member, parent, or guardian.
- 2. Children ages 5 and below will not be allowed on the range, or to be left unsupervised by a parent or guardian while in the facility or left in a car.
- 3. Children ages 14 and under must be accompanied one-on-one with an adult parent or guardian with 100 percent eyes-on supervision. Adult in charge of watching each child will not be allowed to shoot.
- 4. Children will not be left unsupervised on the range or in the facility at any time. Children found unsupervised will be escorted to the adult parent or guardian and asked to leave the property for the safety of the children and others using the facility.
- 5. All children must be fitted with eye and ear protection while visiting the range.
