 - ➤ Minimize vehicle collisions
 - ➤ Minimize disease concerns
 - ➤ Educate residents on negative impacts of feeding wildlife
 - > Reduce the number of residents feeding deer

- Predator/prey relationship






Artificial

- Disease












- Private Property Damage

 - > Fences








- Aggressive Behavior

 - ➤ Pet safety




- Vehicle collisions

Population Management Hunt Options

- Department Kill Permit
- Special Hunt Zone
 - >Archery only hunts for safety
 - Crossbows included
 - Population Management List or Separate hunt code
 - Focus harvest on female segment of population

 Capture Procedures
 - Focus in residential areas
 - ➤ Drop nets
 - ➤ Clover traps





- Trap and Transplant Release Procedures
 - Release sites identified
 - > Hard release
