

Recovery Plan Approved 2003

Threatened: ≥ 250 bighorn in at least 2 populations or metapopulations, each containing ≥100 bighorn.

 Delisted: ≥ 500 bighorn in at least 3 populations or metapopulations, each containing ≥ 100 bighorn.

Impacts of Cougar Control

- Mortality rate from cougar predation decreases 71%
- Mortality rate from all causes decreases 52%



Delisting Process As Mandated by the Wildlife Conservation Act (WCA)

- 2010
 - April Delisting process initiated
 - -May-Assemble peer review panel
 - June Finalize Delisting Report
- 2011
 - May Delisting Proposed to the SGC
 - September Public Hearings held
