

Use of Crossbows for Hunting



Problem – Some crossbow use deleted from previous rules

- Previously allowed in 2004 by Rule
- Mobility Impaired (MI) Hunters
- Used for protected Species
- Including bow, muzzleloader, legal sporting arms hunts
- Allowed & extremely popular with bow hunters with limited abilities to pull a bow

Amendment Considerations

- Allow MI hunters to hunt protected species (game animals, game birds & furbearers
- Allow if established by specific rule
- New allow scopes during muzzleloader and legal sporting arms
- New allow a person temporary injury (reasonable accommodations approved by the Director)

Initiate Draft Rule Proposal

19.31.10.7 DEFINITIONS:

T. "Crossbow" shall mean a device with a bow limb or band of flexible material that is attached horizontally to a stock and has a mechanism to hold the string in a cocked position. Sights <u>or lights</u> on crossbows shall not project light [nor magnify].

Draft - Rule Proposal Continued

I 19.31.10.19 TAKING GAME ANIMALS, FURBEARER, GAME BIRDS BY CROSSBOW:

- A. Crossbows may be used to take or kill any game animal, furbearer or game bird by a licensed hunter in possession of a valid Department Mobility Impaired (MI) card or in possession of a reasonable accommodation issued by the Director, or as otherwise allowed by rule.
- B. It shall be unlawful to hunt with a crossbow without a hunter possessing a MI Card or reasonable accommodation from the Director, or contrary to rule or hunt code.
- C. It shall be unlawful to hunt with a crossbow that has a scope, telescopic sight or magnification device during any bow only hunt for big game.
