Final Proposal Prohibiting the Use of Drones for Hunting (19.31.10 NMAC)





Drones, or Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs), have become more available in recent years. The use of drones to locate or harass protected wildlife is not addressed in current commission rules.





The Department proposes to amend 19.31.10 NMAC, Manner and Method of Taking, to address the use of drones





19.31.10—Hunting and Fishing – Manner and Method of Taking:





19.31.10.7 DEFINITIONS

Z. "Drone" is defined as any device used or designed for navigation or flight in the air that is unmanned and guided remotely or by an onboard computer. Drones may also be referred to as "Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV)" or "Unmanned Aerial Vehicle Systems (UAVS)"

C. Harassing protected wildlife: It shall be unlawful, at any time, to pursue, harass, harry, drive, or rally any protected species by use of or from a motor-driven vehicle, powerboat, sailboat, <u>drone</u> or aircraft.

E. Use of aircraft for spotting game: It shall be unlawful to use aircraft <u>or drone</u> to spot or locate and relay the location of any protected species to anyone on the ground by any means of communication or signaling device or action.





Using information gained from air flight:

(1.) It shall be unlawful to hunt for or to take, or assist in the hunting for or taking of, any protected species with the use of information regarding location of any protected species gained from the use of any aircraft until 48 hours after such aircraft use.

(2.) It shall be unlawful to hunt for or to take, or assist in the hunting for or taking of, any protected species with the use of information regarding location of any protected species gained from the use of any drone at any time.

J. Aircraft, drone and vehicle exemptions to this rule: The Director may exempt a person from the prohibition of utilizing an aircraft, drone or vehicle for management purposes.





Public Involvement

The Commission first raised this issue at the May 15, 2014 Commission meeting. Since that time, the Department has received 36 public comments, all in favor of prohibiting the use of drones to take or assist in the hunting of protected species.
