


# McAllister Lake Wildlife Area





**Location:** McAllister Lake Wildlife Area is located about 7 miles southeast of Las Vegas.

**Total Acreage:** 623 acres.

**Purchase:** McAllister Lake was purchased in 1962 to provide fishing access and winter habitat for

waterfowl.

**Description:** The lake is surrounded by high-plains grasslands and few trees.

# What to See, Do, and Learn

**Wildlife Viewing-**Wildlife watchers may see various waterfowl and bald eagles. Good binoculars are important. The best time to view wildlife is at dawn or dusk.

**Photographing-**The best time to photograph wildlife is at dawn or dusk. A telephoto lens may be important.

**Hiking-**Hiking is the best way to see wildlife at the McAllister Lake Wildlife Area or other wildlife management areas.

**Bicycling-**Allowed only on established roads.

**Horseback Riding-**Allowed but opportunities are extremely limited.

**Camping-**Not allowed at McAllister Lake.

**Hunting-**Waterfowl hunting allowed during open season.

**Fishing-**No fishing opportunties.

**Closures-**McAllister Lake is closed November 1-February 29 except for waterfowl hunting. The lake is open March 1-October 31.

**Facilities-**McAllister Lake Wildlife Area has rest rooms, but no camp sites or drinking water.

Fees-Hunters and anglers must have appropriate licenses and permits. Wildlife viewers, hikers, photographers, and horseback riders must have a valid license or permit. See the Department's website www.wildlife.state.nm. us for more information.

Motorized Vehicles-Not allowed beyond roadway and parking areas.
