


# **Mimbres Wildlife Area**





**Location:** Mimbres Wildlife Area is located approximately 2 miles north of San Lorenzo in Grant County.

**Total Acreage:** 23 acres.

**Purchase:** The Mimbres Wildlife Area was purchased in 1985 to protect habitat for the Chihuahuan chub.

**Description:** The Chihuahuan chub is an endangered fish found nowhere else in the United States. This wildlife area protects a portion of the Mimbres River, home to this unique species.

# What to See, Do, and Learn

**Wildlife Viewing-**Wildlife watchers may see wildlife year-round. Good binoculars are important. The best time to view wildlife is at dawn or dusk.

**Photographing-**The best time to photograph wildlife is at dawn or dusk.

**Hiking-**Hiking is the best way to see wildlife at the Mimbres Wildlife Area year-round or other wildlife management areas.

**Bicycling-**Not allowed.

**Horseback Riding-**Allowed year-round but opportunities are extremely limited.

**Camping-**Not allowed at the Mimbres Wildlife Area.

**Fishing-**Not allowed.

**Hunting-**Not allowed.

**Closures-**The Mimbres Wildlife Area is open year-round.

**Facilities-**There are no rest rooms, camp sites, or drinking water available at the Mimbres Wildlife Area.

**Fees-**Wildlife viewers, photographers, hikers, and horseback riders must have a valid license or permit. See the Department's website www.wildlife.state.nm.us for more information.

**Motorized Vehicles-**Not allowed beyond parking area.
